Dear Mr. Coupal:

This will acknowledge your letter of November 25, 1942 regarding the above property. I am indeed sorry to hear that your engineer in the Globe District has passed away. Could this by any chance have been Mr. Walcott? I knew Mr. Walcott in Mexico and when I was in Globe he was your Field Engineer in that area.

It is noted that you will be in Globe sometime about the 17th or 18th of December and may see Mrs. Newbould.

Our study of the data which you submitted with the letter indicates that although development has been very limited in the property there is a possibility of 2% or 3% copper fluxing ore. Under "Geology and Mineralization" in your report of August 12, 1940 it was indicated that the ore occurs on a diabase quartzite contact, and also that there is limestone present. If by any chance the ore occurs in the quartzite and would assay more than 65% in silica with low alumina it might be that it could be used as a converter flux, in which case 2% or 3% copper ore might be desirable.

Inasmuch as the Dominion Mine at one time operated this property "for some kind of ore used at smelter" there appears a possibility that it may have been used as a siliceous flux.

It is hoped that you may be able to develop this information while you are in Globe.

Dear Mrs. Newbould:

I have received the questionnaire that we sent you relative to the potential copper production from Arizona's small and marginal mines for national defense purposes. The principal pieces of information that we want were not answered, and it is essential that we have this data if we are going to include your property in our report. We are particularly concerned with how much copper your property could produce annually on a 14¢ price, or 16¢, 18¢, or 20¢. We also want the information as to plant facilities that would be required for production at these various prices and how much the capital investment would be to install the necessary plants and equipment.

Your letter indicates that your property could be made to pay with copper at 14¢ per pound, but I feel very sure that it would be necessary to install certain plants and we would have to know what equipment would be necessary and the estimated cost.

The reason for this information is that the plan proposed is something along the line of amortizing the capital cost over a five year period, and in the event the government did not maintain the price and purchased the full output as agreed upon, damages would be incurred by the unamortized portion of the capital investment.

We feel very sure that no plan could be worked out whereby the government would take over the property.

I am sending you another copy of the questionnaire and would appreciate your filling out the information on the questions which are marked. Hoping to hear from you again soon, I am


