Work: A short adit was driven (10 feet) at the end of a cut along a fault zone.

Minerals: Copper and a little gold and silver.

Geology: The area consists of a series of andesite flows which form a shallow cap over granite and schist. The workings are in the andesite along a fault zone which trends NE-SW and is flat dipping (50°) to the southwest. The mineralization consists of chrysocolla, azurite, and some cuprite (?) in the fractures of the shattered andesite. The mineral zone is about 2 feet wide. Mr. Rhoads states that assays ranged from 5 to 12% copper.
