Subject: Report of Operations.

The Roosevelt mine consisting of 6 mining claims is located 6 miles north east of Skullvalley, in Copper Basin District.

Roads to the property by going in byway of Skullvalley are good. To get to the mine, cross the railroad at Skullvalley and take the road as if going to the Boston-Arizona follow the wash almost to the Boston mine then turn to the left and follow road to mine.

The topography is not very rough but is cut by several gulches which level off near the mine. The geology consists of schist and granite cut by a quartz fissure with a N 40 degree E strike, dip 80 degrees having one wall of schist and other granite. The fissure filling is a minh white quartz from I8 inches to three feet thick. The values in the quartz is running from \$4.00 to \$40.00 in gold, no other metal showing.

The fissure has been exposed on the strike by trenching and shallow holes for a distance of 500 feet.

A two compartment shaft is now being sunk on the vein. This shaft is down 30 feet and still in the vein. Some of the quartz is bein g saved from the shaft muck.

The property is owned by Messrs Albert Pessin and Allen Alper who work at the property with four other men, directed by Ed.' Stone.
