

Work: 22 foot shaft on a lode which is 1-2 feet wide, 2 miles of access road.

Geology: The vein lies in andesite flow rocks and ranges from 1-2 feet wide. The vein trends NW-SE and is nearly vertical. It is apparently a filled fissure with a quartz gangue. The silver bearing streak is about 4"-6" wide and runs around 30 oz. silver per ton. The andesite is altered to a green color (probably chlorite) and is somewhat silicified out from the vein.

Plans: Mr. Bennett plans to deepen the shaft to determine if the vein will widen. He wants to patent the claims and wanted a consultant to observe the possibilities.
