#### MINE TAXATION IN ARIZONA

A Compilation of Mine Taxes For Years 1953-1958 Inclusive

The Arizona Department of Mineral Resources has compiled a statistical analysis of the last six years of mine taxation in Arizona. The source of the data was State Tax Commission reports.

The last six years have shown an amazing increase in total property taxes levied in Arizona: from \$54,340,430 in 1953 to \$105,227,216 in 1958, an increase of 93.6 percent. As assessed valuations have increased only 45.8 percent, (from \$899,621,042 to \$1,311,972,257), Arizona's property tax-rate has jumped from \$6.04 in 1953 to \$8.02 in 1958, or 32.8 percent.

During the same six-year period, mining property tax levies have increased from \$8,860,425 in 1953 to \$15,190,363 in 1958, or 71.4 percent; while the assessed valuations have increased from \$180,236,488 to \$209,608,990, or 16.3 percent. The tax-rate per \$100 valuation has increased from \$4.916 to \$7.247, or 47.4 percent.

The special production tax on metals, if added to the property taxes levied on the mining industry, would bring mining taxes to \$10,792,184 in 1953 and \$17,811,148 in 1958, or \$5.988 per \$100 valuation in 1953 and \$8.497 in 1958.

A breakdown of the total property tax-rate into state, county, school and city tax-rates for the years 1953 and 1958, shows how each class has increased during the six-year period: -

It will be noted that the school district tax-rate has been the chief factor in the tax increase. With the increase in Arizona's population, there has been a terrific increase in school attendance. This has also had an effect on the state tax-rate, as the state has to appropriate each year from the general fund \$127. per pupil. In addition, each county is required to appropriate from its general fund the sum of \$30.50 per pupil. The balance of the school expense per pupil is raised by direct school taxation in each county.

Although over 99 percent of mining taxes are paid in only six of the fourteen counties, a large proportion of the amount paid into the state general fund is re-distributed to all the counties according to their average daily school attendance (at \$127 per pupil). Hence the mining companies are contributing to the support of schools in <u>all</u> the counties. Likewise, the production (or sales) tax paid by the mining companies goes into the state general fund (28.4%), all the counties (42.6%), all the cities (10%), social welfare (15.0%), and 4% for administration expense. Here again, even though the mining companies help keep their own county tax-rate down, they also contribute to the support of the other counties.
