

D. 1927, at the hour of 2 o'clock P. M. of that day, for the purpose of electing directors, for the ensuing year and to transact any other business, coming before the meeting. Should you not be able to attend this meeting, you will find enclosed herewith a Proxy, together with self addressed envelope, which we will thank you to fill out and return to us, duly signed by yourself; so that one of our present directors will represent your holdings.

It is with regret we advise at this time; our company has suffered a serious loss, a snow fall of four feet, followed by fourteen inches of rain caused a landslide in the rear of our Mill. The 40,000 gallon Reservoir was undermined, and with the rush of Sand, Rock and Water, the power wing of Mill was carried away. Air compressor was ruined and other engines and machinery damaged. Main Mill Building moved eighteen inches off base. This accident occurred February 14th of this year. Being an act of Providence, was unforeseen and unavoidable. We were about ready to operate the mill and commence milling ore at the time of landslide. The delay in time will be approximately 90 days from date of accident. The financial loss will be considerable. We have rushed re-construction with splendid progress every day since, when weather would permit. We anticipate an early date for operation.

Development for the past year has been pushed rapidly, keeping in mind the economic and safe construction of same. Thus far all problems have been met and solved. The physical condition of the property is good and we look forward with renewed confidence.

Be assured that we are serving your every interest well and thanking you to bear with us in our efforts to make a big success of the Silver Crown Mines, we are
