One 20 foot shaft on a stringer lode.

Geology: Narrow veins trending NE-SW at an angle to the general volcanic flow trend, which is roughly NW-SE. Perry stated that the rock has been reported to be andesite. It is hoped by the owners that the galena bearing veinlets would coalesce or widen in depth. Perry was not certain about dip but thought that it was nearly vertical. The gangue is quartz and calcite. Perry worked there for 2 months for a few days at a time.
