change of rules in filing mining claims?

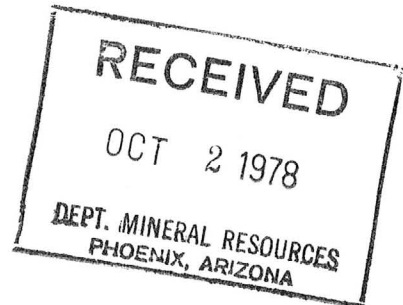
Two of your men were out to my lead-silver

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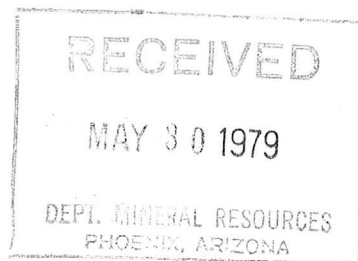
