Had a letter from Mr. Copeland, Prescott saying he had an option on Dave Peters Au claims in Copper Basin. GW WR 5/31/72

KP/WR 7/23/79 - Mr. Brooks Copeland, Prescott, Phone 445-3570, reported he had hired Mr. Kirwan to examine his Slate Creek Mine, Hassayampa Dist., Yav., property and write a report. One sample by Kirwan reportedly ran 78 tr. oz/ton silver, 54% lead, 2.5 Tr. oz/ton gold and 3.75 tr.oz/ton platinum. Mr. Copeland said recent bulldozer work on the property has exposed more good showings.

KAP WR 2/9/79. Assisted in interpreting a magnetic map of the Slate Creek Mine with owner Mr. Copeland and George Schaffer. The map showed two possible magnetic anomalies.
