



KAP WR 6/22/84: William J. Staley, (c) Wickenbrug, Arizona is prospecting a barite and iron stained outcrop in the S $\frac{1}{2}$, Sec 35, T8N R4W. He pointed out the location on the Wickenbrug, Arizona 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ quadrangle. The site appears to be the same as is covered by the Standard Mine (file) Yavapai County and Yavapai MILS Index #287. Barite was not listed as a potential commodity, but the sample brought in by Mr. Staley contained barite as the primary mineral.



Subject: Preliminary report



The Standard or Horseshoe Group of 3 unpatented mining claims owned by Mr. Cuno Selle of Wickenburg Arizona is located in the Blue Tank mining district of Yavapai County and is situated from Wickenburg, a station on the Santa-Fe railroad, by about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles of maintained county road and $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles of good dirt road, via the road to Constellation and the old road to Phoenix.

The property lies at an elevation of around 3,000 feet in gently rolling desert hills. The vegetation is typically Sonoran and the climate is arid.

The mineralization occurs in a quartz vein which follows roughly the contact between a granitic mass and a dacite porphyry. The zone of contact strikes approximately 20 degrees East of North. The dip of the vein is not clearly defined but will probably not vary greatly from vertical. Three copper minerals were identified; cuprite, azurite and chrysocolla. It is reported, also, that the vein carries some value in Gold. Mr. Selle also reports the occurrence of nickel.

Very little has been done to bring the property into development. There is a shaft about 15 feet deep on the Standard claim near the Horseshoe end line which exposes 18 inches of good copper ore which ultimately pinches at the bottom of the shaft to a mere thread. There is another shaft on the Horseshoe claim about 18 feet in depth which exposes similar ore to a width of about 8 inches at the bottom that is said to assay as follows:

Gold	Copper
\$8.80	6.48%

This latter shaft is collared with one set and lagged. There are also incidental shafts and trenches on the property exposing the geology.

There are two dug wells about 30 feet deep in the bottom of a dry wash which traverses the property. Water stands in both of these to a depth of about 15 feet. One of the wells is neatly collared with cement and neatly covered, and seemingly in excellent condition. There is, also, a two cabin camp about 500 feet from the wells which is very comfortable, neat, and gaily painted in red, green, and blue. Each claim is clearly marked with striped posts in the same three striking hues which harmonize so well with the natural color of the ore -- putting the property in a very colorful and handsome setting.

In conclusion, I would highly recommend this property to anyone wishing to develop a copper mine while enjoying a salubrious desert scene.
