Property: 1 unpatented claim.

Location: 9 miles west of Quartzsite and 1/2 mile south of highway 60-70.

Owner: E.D. Strange, General Delivery, Quartzsite.

Mineral: Silica (quartz breccia)

Work: One location cut (10 ft. deep).

Geology: The zone in which the deposit occurs is described under "Oro Fino Area" in connection with the Wood and Congdon-Carey properties. The quartz, according to assay sheets, shown by Strange, assays 99 per cent SiO₂ and traces of other elements. According to Strange, he has traced the silica outcrop continuously for 1500 feet, or more, and that it is up to 100 feet in width. The angular fragments of quartz are loosely cemented and range from 1/8 to 1/2 inch in diameter. Some of it is white, but some is faintly red stained on the outside of the fragments. Strange said that he was not sure that the silica zone conformed to the general schistosity.
