The following information was received by the field engineer from the following persons:

(1) S. L. Kelly, Kelco Enterprises, P. O. Box 343, Carlsbad, Calif. in a

telephone conversation on April 22, 1963.

(2) Jack G. Marks, Commissioner, County Court House, Tucson, Ariz. in a telephone conversation June 28, 1963 (Mr. Marks replaced Morris Udall as secretary of Sunnyside Water Co., while this company was still in existence)

(3) Odin Sundness, Santa Rita Hotel, 109 S. Scott in a telephone conversation

on June 28, 1963.

References ---- Report of Sunnyside Water Co. under date of Feb. 23, 1960.

Mr. Marks informed me that the Sunnyside Water Co. was sold some time ago to the Sovereign Resources, and also that he understands that Arizona Steel (referred to in my report of Sunnyside Water Co.) was sold or absorbed by Sovereign Resources. Consequently, there is no more 'Sunnyside Water Co.' and no more 'Atizona Steel'. It is all 'Sovereign Resources'.

Mr. Kelly informed me that Sovereign Resources, which he is now connected with, owns 2h sections of Federal land, and have State leases on h sections of State land, located in T 8 S - R 11 E and T 9 S - R 11 E. He stated that has they had recently drilled a well in Sec. 31 - T 8 S - R 11 E, which is almost 1,000 ft. deep and produces 1,500 gal. per min. of water. He remarked "that iron deal is to go". Note that the 28 sections mentioned by Mr. Kelly are theseme 28 sections that were leased to Arizona Steel (See report of Sunnyside Water Co. 2/23/60)

Mr. Sundness stated that C. M. (Mickie) Wood of New York City was now the President of Sovereign Resources and that S. Y. Guthrie is out. He said that Sovereign Resources has a low grade iron deposit in the eastern part of Texas, which they plan to develop and treat in a plant in Texas. After they get a good start on that enterprise, they plan on doing something with the magnetite in the Florence Makker—Oracle Jct. area.


