The Bureau of Land Management has advised that patent has been issued for placer mining claims known as Sunset #1 and Sunset #2, in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 9, Township 1 North, Range 5 East, comprising 40 acres, Mesa Mining District, Maricopa County, AZ, to Earl C. Johnson and John L. Johnson.

Remember the snail darter, the famous little endangered species that stopped the world or at least the Tellico Dam? The Fish and Wildlife Service is now proposing to delist the snail darter or, at the very least, take it out of endangered species status. It seems that the rare snail darter, upon search, has been found in a number of tributaries of the Tennessee River as well as the main stem. So it is no longer endangered, according to an advance notice in the Federal Register. This could be the first United States species delisted under the Endangered Species Act because of abundance.
