Comment: Prior to his death Mr Weston obtained a \$4,000 RFC loan but did not go ahead with it. Records and reports are with RFC. Recommended to Mrs Weston that she obtain these. RFC Mine Docket No. B-2765.

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This property was granted an RFC loan, given to Mr O A Weston under the Docket No. B-2765. Mrs. Weston has little information beyond the following data but she will be glad to interview those interested in the property and to put them in contact with those who can show them her property. Mr. Weston was authorized a loan of \$4,000 for preliminary development. The understanding was if this preliminary work resulted in a showing that justified it, a further loan for deeper development would be considered, but Mr. Weston, for reasons of his own, did not take the loan.

According to information available a vein dipping 30 deg on which a shaft had been sunk a matter of 50 or more feet. The top of this shaft was caved tight but there was a vertical shaft sunk on top of this vein that was 71 feet deep and from the bottom a short crosscut had been cut into the old inclined shaft a few feet above the bottom. The bottom of the inclined shaft, it is reported showed a quartz vein which averaged 12 inches wide. This quartz was only exposed for a matter of 4 or 5 feet above the bottom; above that the vein was more or less obliterated by oxidation. Four samples across the bottom and on the sides near the bottom averaged \$20 in gold. The vein was mineralized with heavy iron sulphide scattered through the quartz and selected sorted sample of this material showed \$44.00 in gold. According to data available the work proposed under the loan as granted was to sink the vertical shaft until it intersected the inclined vein which would be at a point about 40 feet lower down the incline.

Mrs Weston can give information as to the work which Mr Weston did with other money at a later time.
