

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



Geology and Mineralization

This group lays in the Pinal Schist app. 5 miles from Miami Ariz (air line) Mineralization is secondary. . There are a series of fissures radiating from a central dyke (?) which runs along the Southern line of this property. The fissures have been prospected and partially mined. The Summit and Interdimate leads of Gibson are two of these fissures. The fissures shown on the map of the Hardscrabble and Cracker Jack are of this character. They have not been throughly prospected.

The central dyke that is mentioned above. Shows typical iron capping of copper leads of this district. Specularite is the premonidate mineral although some pyrites are present. Traces of copper show also. From Malachite to Bournite. One sample from this lead showed traces of tungsten. Probably of no value. ~~xxxxx~~ There has been no prospecting of this lead. Tunnel 5 of the map was probably driven in the hope of striking it but evidently funds gave out before it was cut.
