Tungsten property comprising two claims, foot of Yarnell Hill, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles westerly from Phoenix Prescott Highway.

Fifteen hundred foot fracture. Vein of oxidized material approximately six inches to two feet wide, in which occurs streaks of high grade Ferberite one to $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches thick from 20% to 60% WOz. Oxidized material shows values of upwards to $2\frac{1}{2}$ % WOz. The highgrade tungsten comes in say for twenty of thirty feet along the vein and then eight of ten feet in depth, then diappears, and on sincking reappears again for say ten or twelve more feet in depth.

Development work consisted of trenching along the fracture and sinking in a couple of places to a maximum depth of 40 feet. High grade ore shipped ran from \$560.00 perton to a \$1000.00. Second grade, rejects about 8% WO3 Oxidized material not saved.

At the time work was stopped, April 30, 1944, deepest workings were about forty feet and the high grade had just pinched out although the vein was there and good and we intended to go on down to the next highgrade (this had occurred three times before) when the Metals Reserve cancelled the Purchase Contract and we werent warranted to spend the money for further sinking or exploration with no market for our product if we did open up more high grade.

Property is still a good prospect and might work into something with further work and development. Past experience has shown that it will pay its way.
