Name and address of applicant (correspondent): H. S. Neel, P. O. Box 4082, Phoenix, Arizona. 2. Character of project and estimated cost thereof: Road work, unwatering and repairing mine - \$5,000. Location of Property: Hereford Mining District, Cochise County, Arizona. 4. Applicant's interest in or ownership of property: Applicant leases from recorded owners. 5. Loan requested: \$5,000. 6. Loan recommended: \$2,500. 7. Commonts: (A) Independent sampling by Jonathon Gordon indicates a fairly persistent and mineable width of copper-silver ore. While the tennage to be anticipated would not be large in the immediate future, the copper content of the relatively high grade ore would be appreciable and added gold-silver values would contribute to repayment of the loan. (B) The location of the mine is favorable in respect to marketing facilities, being about 50 miles from the Douglas smelter, but local road conditions are poor and the mine is at present accessible only by trail from a forest road. This condition would preclude the shipment of ore at the present time but, while making operations somewhat inconvenient, would not probibit the unwatering and repairs needed to "prove" the property. (C) Actual unwatering operations will not be expensive and the applicant has requested funds for roads and a camp. It is considered that those projects are of secondary importance at the present time and that no funds should be advanced for a road and only minimum temporary camp requirements installed. The expenditures under the type of operation should not exceed \$2,500.00. If the property is then found worthy, a mine access road can be built through utilization of federal funds allotted for such projects.
