

REPORT ON WILLIAMS PROPERTY

Dear Sir:

I am herewith submitting a report upon what is known as the Williams property, situated in Yavapai County, Arizona.

PROPERTY: The property consists of five (5), nearly, full claims held by possessory right, located in the Hassayampa Mining District in Arizona, and were originally located by one Fred Williams.

LOCATION: This property is located in what is known as the Bradshaw Mountains about 10 miles south of the town of Prescott, Arizona, and near the Hassayampa River. The property can be easily reached by automobile on the main highway that runs from Bradshaw to the country to the south.

TOPOGRAPHY: This property lies in a mountainous area at an elevation of about 8000 ft. above sea level. The Hassayampa River cuts through this range, in fact one of the claims lies adjacent to it.

The area in general is accessible the year around over good automobile roads, and in fact, the mine can be reached directly by auto.

GEOLOGY: The geology of this particular area is quite general over that section of the country, the principal rocks being diorite, Yavapai schist, and quartz diorite.

The principal veins of the Williams property lie between diorite and slates, and are cut at right angles by a very dark basic rock, probably diorite.

The following mines, which have a record of considerable production, lie adjacent to this property: The Senator, which produced millions, the Cash, and the Sun Dance Mine; all having the same geology, so it would be only repetition to go into detail on this point.

The veins themselves consist practically of a ferruginous quartz which would indicate high oxidization; the principal economic minerals found in the veins being gold and copper. Free gold is not common in the veins of this region, the gold values lying principally in the sulphides, chiefly pyrite and chalcopyrite. Nevertheless, considerable bodies of very rich ore in free gold have been discovered at depth, and I was told that one very rich pocket was found on the surface of what is known as the "April Fool" claim.

Considerable work has been done on the Cash and the Senator and a large production was made at depth. I understand that very little surface showing was found on either of these properties. The veins in the Senator were from 3 to 6 feet wide and are parallel to the veins which exist in the Williams property.

There is very little work at the present time on the Williams property excepting on the surface outcrops, but assays have been obtained from these properties ranging from \$4 to \$26.

Assessment work has been concentrated on a tunnel on the Cora Bell which is in 200 feet on a very strong vein showing good walls. The vein has a strike N. 65° E.

CONCLUSION: I consider these claims very valuable, as they are in a well mineralized belt and are surrounded by patented mining claims that have in the past produced millions. I will say, however, that the possibilities of developing ore bodies upon the Williams property are very favorable and the conditions that existed in the Senator, Cash and others, exist upon the Williams property. The topography of the country and the location of the claims will permit the driving of a tunnel into this ground at or near the Hassayampa River, from which a good depth could be obtained and the veins as exposed on the Williams property would be cut.

I found upon examination of the surface three distinct quartz veins which can be traced for the entire length of the claims (see map).

RECOMMENDATIONS: I would recommend that these claims be immediately surveyed for patent and that some effort be made by the owners to interest capital to drive the tunnel as already mentioned, as I have no doubt that the same showings could be found in these claims as were found in the adjacent claims of this district.
