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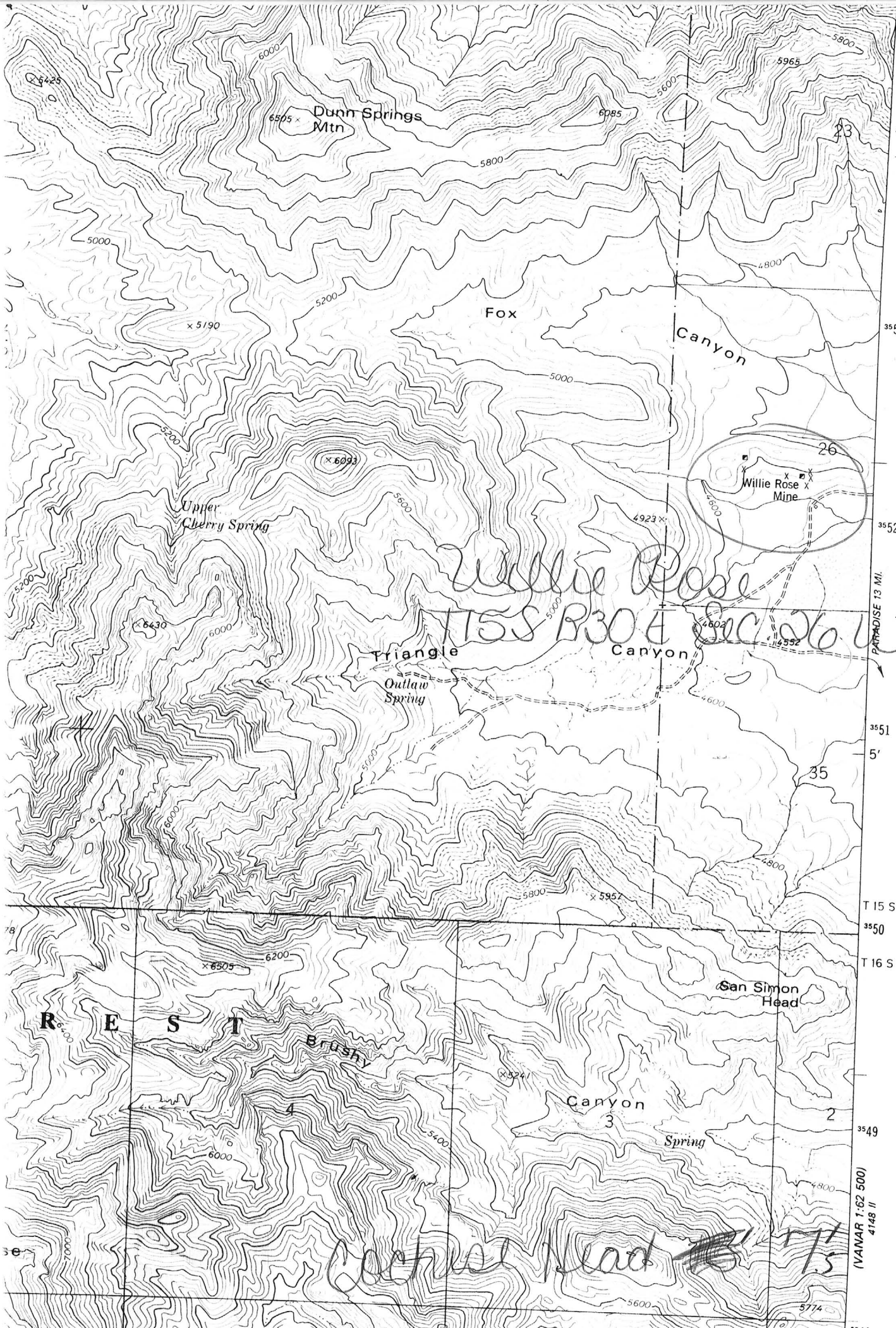

NJN WR 7/11/86: Woodlief Fred Brown (card) visited and reported that he is still the owner of the Willie Rose (file) Cochise County. He provided us with his new address: 933 South Pioneer, Abilene, Texas 79605. He has some chalcocite copper mineralization on which he would like to do some exploration drilling. He has gained patent to his mine through an exchange with the BLM. He is currently planning to stake some additional claims. When he applied for patent in 1967 (prior to the land trade) a geological report was prepared by Walt Heinrichs (card). During the past 35 years Mr. Brown has made one shipment which contained 40% copper and 4.5 oz Ag per ton.

Dear Sir:

Bureau of Land Management notice Serial No. A3732, Arizona, is of Classification of Public Lands for Transfer Out of Federal Ownership. It is dated February 2nd and published in the Federal Register, Volume 35, No. 30, February 12, 1970. Included in paragraph 4 of the notice are Public Lands in Section 26, Township 15 South, Range 30 East.

The inclusion of these Section 26 lands is objected to because they cover claims of the Willie Rose copper mine. The mine has a record of small production and application for patent to five of its mining claims was made around the first of 1967.

It is our belief that such mineralized lands should not be withdrawn from appropriation under the mining or mineral leasing laws unless it is clearly evident that it is in the public interest to do so.

7. Comments:
(A) Shaft #2 has been inaccessible for years and nothing is known relative to workings and ore if any. Re-entry would, by applicant's admission, be speculative exploration.

(B) Shaft #1, which has been recently accessible and from which shipments have been made, is reported to have an interesting ore showing in the bottom of the stope. The reported shipments and stoped areas roughly indicate 15% of the vein material was sorted as ore. On this basis the various "pay streaks" combine to a total width of less than 1 foot. These streaks are, however, distributed over the vein width in such a manner as the entire vein must be broken simultaneously and the high grade sorted out. It does not appear that this method will yield a profit.

Furthermore, the stope bottom is below the drift level. Either underhand stoping must be adopted or further development performed to get under this ore.

The extent and value of the ore is somewhat doubtful and the risk is not commensurate with the copper to be gained. The loan is therefore not recommended.

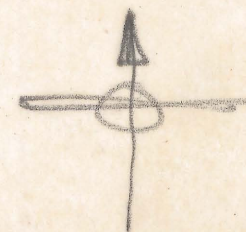
