

On July 25, 1980, Mr. Frank Russell of San Diego, California, reported he had, in the company of Everett Yount of Crown King, Arizona, visited the Wire Gold Mine, Pine Grove District, Yavapai County. Mr. Russell reported that Everett Yount, a Crown King area miner, had suggested he look at the abandoned Wire Gold Mine and locate the ground which was reportedly "open". On July 23, 1980, Mr. Russell, accompanied by Mr. Yount, went to the property. Access to the property is by 4-wheel drive road and then one mile on foot.

A single sample of good-looking rock was taken from the dump of old workings for assay. Russell felt that such a sample would assist him in determining a further course of action.

Mr. Russell reports a steeply dipping quartz vein 12" wide in an altered zone. The vein appears to have been exposed by a shaft and drift. A small dump and caved opening is all that remains.

The property was known in the early 1950's as the Wire Gold Mine. George H. Bigler of then P.O. Box 35, Crown King, held the claim by location in 1954.
