Subject: Conference with Pete (Jesus) Daniels, Box 21, Ehrenburg, 3/10/65.

PROPERTY: 14 claims:
(1) 10 Yellow Dollar Claims on S side of a large wash.
(2) 4 Flat Gold Claims on N side of a large wash.

LOCATION: S22, T3N, R21W, (adjoin Metate Claims.)

OWNER: Jesus (Pete) Daniels & Son, Box 21, Ehrenburg

MINERAL: Placer gold and magnetite.

DEVELOPMENT: Several 3-5 foot bulldozer trenches from which the gravel was stockpiled. According to Daniels the ground runs variably according to the location of the principal old channels, assaying \$1 to \$6 per yard. Some of the gold is in the magnetite grains, and most of the free gold is rough having been transported only a short distance. Most of it ranges from 1/64 to 1/8 inch, in size, larger nuggets being rare. The pebbles, cobbles, and boulders are composed of quartz, schist and diorite in the area, but most of the gravel is not over average sizes. The gravels are generally shallow in depth often, only 3 feet.

PLANS: Daniels is planning to patent 2 of the claims.
