1. NAME AND ADDRESS OF APPLICANT:

2. LOCATION OF PROJECT:

In Sec. 31, T. 21 S., R. 16 E., Santa Cruz, County Arizona, 3.5 miles from Patagonia, Arizona.

3. AMOUNT OF LOAN AND DATE OF AUTHORIZATION:

A loan of \$5,000.00 was approved in October, 1942.

4. PURPOSES FOR WHICH LOAN WAS EXPENDED:

To retimber and rehabilitate the underground workings of Borrower's copper mine.

5. EQUIPMENT:

a. 1 - Pump Jack - Fairbanks Morris - - - - - \$100.88
1 - Used Fairbanks - Morris Hoist (with Dodge Motor),
Model G.A. - Type 3804, Serial No. - 1832309 - - - - 137.00
1 - International Pick-up truck 1938 - D-2 - Serial
No. - 33441, Engine No. - HD.213-36753 - - - - - 500.00
Miscellaneous small tools - - - - - Stolen

b. International truck in Mrs. Miller's possession at her home

c. Hoist was sold for \$25.00 in June, 1944. Mrs. Henrietta E. Miller handed Mr. Tweedy the \$25.00 in currency June 21, 1944, which was subsequently forwarded to Federal Reserve Bank for credit against indebtedness of borrower.

According to a letter from Mrs. Miller she returned the pump jack to Steinfelds for \$90.88 and applied proceeds on unpaid wages.

d. According to the same letter Mrs. Miller intends to purchase truck in the near future.

6. PROPERTY:

Borrower holds property by right of location under state and federal laws.

7. COMMENTS:

Operations terminated on property in June, 1943, and project was abandoned. Project was never visited by a Supervising Engineer.

8. CONCLUSIONS:

The project failed to develop any material quantity of ore, and with the exception of the remaining equipment worth salvaging, the property is believed to be of no value. Consequently, except for the salvage value of equipment the loan should be considered a loss.

9. RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that this account be closed when the remaining equipment acquired with loan funds which is considered worth salvaging has been liquidated and proceeds applied on borrower's indebtedness.

2. Character of project and estimated cost thereof:
Equipping mine to unwater - examine; sink winze on ore - crosscut - and raise on ore. Estimated cost, \$5,000.
3. Location of property:
3½ miles from Patagonia, Wrightson Mining District, Santa Cruz County, Arizona.
4. Applicant's interest in or ownership of property:
Applicant is one of two partners, each one holding an undivided half interest in unpatented mining claims.
5. Loan requested:
\$5,000.
6. Loan recommended:
\$5,000.
7. Comments:
 - (A) I made a casual inspection of this property in November, 1941 in order to advise as to development work required.
 - (B) The brief description of the ore on the tunnel level does not do the showing justice. The ore body shows for a length of 80 feet of mineable width of commercial grade. The winze on this ore body is down 20 feet in ore. The ore showing continues in depth at the bottom of qinze (authentically reported) and no stoping has been done above tunnel level.
 - (C) For development it is recommended that the winze on ore be unwatered and sunk by hand windlass another 30 or 40 feet; that the 110 foot winze be unwatered and the crosscut to ore and then raise on ore to bottom of winze.
 - (D) If, and when, the crosscut opens sufficient ore showing the 110 foot winze can be raised through to surface for efficient hoisting.
