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




Howell Group of Claims




REPORT ON HOWELL GROUP OF MINING CLAIMS

Gentlemen:

Pursuant to arrangements made through Messrs. Moore, Rowley and Roca, Attorneys of Phoenix, I have examined the mining claims listed below and herewith submit the following report:

PROPERTY AND LOCATION

The unpatented lode mining claims which I shall term the Howell Group are located in the Apache (Cave Creek) Mining District of Arizona, and comprise the following:

Jessie #1

Jessie #2

Lucky Strike

Ruthie

and

Keystone

as shown on the attached sketch captioned Exhibit A.

All of these claims have been legally staked and recorded in Maricopa County as per information furnished by your local attorneys. Each of the claims approximately conforms to the legal limits of area with length of 1500' and width of 600' and while some of the stakes have been destroyed and the location notices have apparently

been stolen from the discovery points on the Jessie #1 and #2 and Keystone, yet I was assured by William Bentley, who guided me over the property, that all of the stakes and notices had been in order some 3 years ago and the present defects would not affect the validity of the possessory title which to all appearances was properly obtained and is still vested in the owners of record.

These claims lie in section 23 of Township 6 North, Range 3 East, Gila and Salt River Base and Meridian, in Maricopa County, Arizona. By air line they are about 8 miles slightly north of west from the Post Office at Cave Creek from which they are reached by 9 miles of road, the last 3.5 miles of which is rough but passable. The road distance from Phoenix to the claims is 34 miles and it is reported that the cost of truck freight to or from Phoenix is \$3.00 per ton.

The country may be described as semi-desert with no trees except a few small palo-verdes and other vegetation limited to cactus and native shrubs and grasses; the outcrops of rock occupy a large percentage of the area and elsewhere the soil is sandy and very light.

The surface is rugged and rises from a flat as one goes north from the Jessie to a height of about 500' on the Ruthie, the elevation above sea level being approximately 3500' to 3000'.

The climate is warm and dry with very hot summers and mean annual rainfall presumably the same as at Phoenix, about 8".

No water is found on the claims nor between Apache Springs about 2 miles to the northeast and Rogers Springs, 3 miles to the northwest.

### HISTORY

According to Mr. Bentley, he was the original locator of three of the Howell Claims in 1930 and previously a certain Jim Humphreys had located the other two. Since no pay ore was found in any of them in quantities sufficient to have a commercial value or to encourage further prospecting, these locators or their successors discontinued the annual assessment work and thus eventually left them open for re-staking as was done by the Howells in 1935 and 1937. Subsequent work done between these dates and 1939 (according to my information) merely consisted in the extension or deepening of prospect pits and trenches and no substantial amount of mining could be found anywhere on the property nor any evidence that ore had been shipped.

### GEOLOGY

The basal formation is pre cambrian schist and granite with numerous intrusions of later volcanic rocks, mainly diorite, andesite and rhyolite. Along or near the contacts of these intrusions or in surface fissures that were formed by some earth disturbances, veins of quartz have formed and these have in places been impregnated by surface solutions with iron oxide and with a little iron ~~and~~ sulphide and to a small extent with copper which has precipitated in the form of carbonate and silicate.

Nowhere on these claims did I see anything that could be classed as an ore body or as a showing likely to develop into one. The veins are all of the gash or superficial type and entirely

similar to many other veins found in that vicinity where in some cases many thousands of dollars have been spent in development work without in a single instance proving up a profitable mine.

#### DETAILS OF WORK

The two Jessie Claims lie end to end extending in a north-west direction actually about north 50° west. On Jessie #2 is located a small cabin in which a little furniture has been left including a stove, table and chairs.

About 500' northwest of the cabin is found a discovery pit 8' in depth located on a contact of diorite and <sup>rhyolite</sup> ~~monzonite~~ where a small fracture contains quartz and a little iron oxide.

To the north and west there are a number of small cuts and pits, none of which show any metallic minerals, but the line of the quartz can be traced for about 1500' to the discovery shaft on the Jessie #1 where there is a cross vein striking N. 60° E. and here some silicate and carbonates of copper are associated with the quartz and brecciated wall rock and my sample of picked specimens on the dump of a 10' shaft assayed

Several other pits were noted in this vicinity but none of them showed any persistent vein or gave promise of developing copper ore since such stains of copper as were noted near the

outcrops unvariably pinched or faded out in the shafts at depths of from 3 to 6'.

The most western development work was found close to the northwest limit of the claim.

The discovery pit on the Keystone Claim from which the notice had been removed was located some 2000' south 80° E. from the cabin and apparently the lines of this claim run almost due east and west. Here the location work consists of a trench about 15' long terminating in a 5' pit.

These openings are in granite close to the contact with a dike of what is usually termed "birdseye porphyry" and there is a narrow vein along the contact with some showing of copper. My picked sample from this point assayed

Gold trace  
Silver trace  
Copper 4.21%.

The Ruthie and Lucky Strike Claims join the northeast side line of the Jessie Claims and extend to the northeast up the slope of Humphreys Hill where the discovery pit on the Ruthie is near to the summit of the ridge some 500' higher than the flat which lies south of the cabin.

Considerable work was done at this point including a trench through the spur of the hill and a short distance to the east a nearly vertical shaft was sunk to a depth of some 40' but the ladder is no longer safe so that I could not descend.

Examination of the trenches and of the upper portion of the shaft showed a quartz seam at or near a contact of diorite and andesite in which some iron oxide and a few stringers of iron sulphide were noted, and since it seemed possible that some gold values might occur in this formation I took a sample which assayed only

Gold 0.02 oz. per ton (\$0.70).

The Lucky Strike Claim on which the location notices were found lies to the southeast of the Ruthie and apparently parallel with it and here there are several shallow trenches and a 6' pit in which a little iron oxide is found in the wall rock and in narrow seams of quartz. A sample of specimens from the dump assayed

Gold 0.03 oz. per ton (\$1.05).

#### CONCLUSION

While the property can only be classed as a prospect it is my very definite opinion that it is a most unpromising prospect and has not and never will have any value for mining or other purposes, and therefore I could not advise that any money whatever should be spent for further exploration or development.


The geological and physical conditions are all adverse and although this district has been explored for 60 years or more, not a single mine has ever yet been developed in this formation.

nor has any valuable mine been developed in this particular district.

There is a very remote chance that some new and quite unprecedented discovery in the vicinity of the Howell Claims might alter the picture and therefore it would be well for the present owners to hold onto these claims as long as no annual assessment work is required by law or other expense involved in so doing; but I am regretfully obliged to advise you that in my opinion the chances of their ever having any value are extremely remote.

Dear Mr. Margiotti:

We have received your letter of May 29th with which you enclosed Notice of Mining Location executed by Mary Ellen Howell and Richard William Howell and covering mining claim known as Jessie No. 1 located in Maricopa County, with Affidavit of Labor Performed and Improvements Made on Jessie No. 1, Jessie No. 2, Keystone, Ruthie and Lucky Strike mining claims executed by Richard William Howell on September 8, 1941. You ask in your letter for advice as to the validity of the title to this mining property and for information as to the merits or value thereof.

First let us say that any opinion as to the validity of the title to an unpatented mining claim must be necessarily qualified inasmuch as not all matters affecting title are required by law to be recorded. We have made a very careful and extended search of the records of the County Recorder of Maricopa County, and upon the basis of that search are pleased to be able to give you the following information:

The mining claim known as Jessie No. 1 was located on May 25, 1937 and a Notice of Location was properly recorded on June 3, 1937 in Book 40 of Mines at page 86. The location notice was filed in the name of Richard William Howell and Mary Ellen Howell, and subject to any unrecorded rights in others, these parties are still the record owners. That Richard William Howell and Mary Ellen Howell may have conveyed by instrument of record some interest in the property would seem to be indicated by the Affidavit of Labor executed on June 6, 1938 by Richard William Howell and filed in Book 36 of Mines at page 579. In that affidavit, Richard William Howell described himself, Martin Luther Howell and Mary Ellen Howell as owners. On July 6, 1940, Richard William Howell filed another Affidavit of Labor, recorded in Book 41 of Mines at page 232 which he described himself and Martin Luther Howell as owners. On September 8, 1941, he filed another affidavit recorded in Book 41 of Mines at page 360 describing himself and Martin Luther Howell as owners. On April 26, 1943, Martin Luther Howell in Instrument 12063, executed a claim for suspension of the require-

ment of annual assessment work, which document was filed on April 28, 1943. A similar Notice of Suspension was filed on April 29, 1943, Document 12120, by Mrs. Agnes Howell and Richard William Howell.

The mining claim known as Jessie No. 2 located fifteen hundred feet Southeast of Jessie No. 1 was located on May 25, 1937 by Mary Ellen Howell and Richard William Howell and location notice was recorded on June 3, 1937 in Book 40 of Mines at page 87. An Affidavit of Labor was filed by Richard William Howell on June 6, 1938 and appears in Book 36 of Mines at page 578. This affidavit is in form substantially similar to that covering Jessie No. 1 and recorded in Book 36 at page 579. The affidavits of July 6, 1940 and September 8, 1941 and the suspension notices of April 26, 1943 and April 29, 1943 above referred to, also include this claim.

On December 26, 1935, Mary Ellen Howell, Richard William Howell and Martin Luther Howell located the Lucky Strike claim five miles East of Cave Creek and location notice was recorded on December 28, 1935 in Book 39 of Mines at page 388. On June 3, 1937, Richard William Howell filed an Affidavit of Labor on this claim, which affidavit was recorded in Book 36 at page 499. The affidavit is entitled in the names of Martin Luther Howell and Richard William Howell, but is signed only by Richard William Howell. Another labor affidavit was executed on June 6, 1938 and recorded in Book 36 of Mines at page 580. This affidavit is almost identical in form with ones of the similar date filed in connection with the two preceding claims. Labor affidavit was also filed by Richard William Howell on August 25, 1939 and recorded in Book 41 of Mines at page 101 and the property was included in affidavit of July 6, 1940 and the suspension notices of April 26, 1943 and April 29, 1943 above referred to.

On December 2, 1935, Richard William Howell, Mary Ellen Howell, Martin Luther Howell and Agnes C. Howell located the Ruthie Mine six miles West of the town of Cave Creek and location notice was recorded on December 28, 1935 in Book 36 of Mines at page 389. This property is covered by Affidavit of Labor of June 3, 1937 mentioned in connection with the Lucky Strike Mine and is included in the affidavits of June 6, 1938, July 6, 1940, September 8, 1941, and in the suspension notices of April 26, 1943 and April 29, 1943. 39

The Keystone Mine was located on December 2, 1935 by Richard William Howell, Martin Luther Howell, Agnes C. Howell and Mary Ellen Howell, lies six miles West of the town of Cave Creek and location notice was recorded on December 28, 1935 in Book 39 of Mines at page 390. It is important in tracing title to this property not to confuse it with numerous other mining claims of

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the same name located by L. T. Dale, J. I. Crockett, and others. The property in question is the subject of a labor affidavit of June 3, 1937 recorded in Book 36 of Mines at page 500. This affidavit is substantially similar to those of the same date covering the Ruthie and Lucky Strike claims. The property was included in affidavits previously referred to filed on June 6, 1938, August 25, 1939, July 6, 1940 and September 8, 1941, and is included in the two suspension notices referred to above.

The writer has made a very careful check of the records of mortgages, deeds, agreements, bonds for deeds, and leases and has also examined the Miscellaneous records of the county and has found nothing in any way involving any of the parties. The records in the Recorder's office are indexed alphabetically, and no block system of indexing with respect to mining property is available either there or at the offices of either of the title guaranty companies in Phoenix. It may therefore be that instruments have been recorded by and between parties other than the Howells, which might in some way affect title to the mining property in question, but that possibility is remote. The law does not require that affidavits of annual labor be filed, but except in periods of depression and war when Congress has suspended the requirement of annual assessment work, annual labor must be performed in order to retain title against a subsequent possessor. You will note from the list of labor affidavits that such documents reciting the performance of annual labor have not been filed for each of the years following the location of the claims, but such fact does not constitute a flaw in title unless the labor was not actually performed.

It is barely possible that the actual location of the properties, that is, the posting of notices on the ground and the erection of proper monuments, was not in all cases performed strictly in accordance with the law, but information on this point is not of course available in the absence of an inspection of the ground.

With the reservations which we have indicated in this letter, we can therefore conclude that so far as the records of Maricopa County show, title to Jessie No. 1 and Jessie No. 2 mining claims is in Mary Ellen Howell and Richard William Howell, title to the Lucky Strike claim is in Mary Ellen Howell, Richard William Howell and Martin Luther Howell and title to the Ruthie and Keystone claims is in Richard William Howell, Martin Luther Howell, Agnes C. Howell and Mary Ellen Howell.

Responding to the other portion of your letter, may we say that the only outstanding mining engineer available at the present time for such a survey and report that you request, is Mr. G. M. Colvocoresses, Luhrs Tower, Phoenix, Arizona. We have contacted Mr. Colvocoresses and he expresses an entire willingness to make the examination you suggest. The standard fee for such services is as you may know

\$100.00 per day in addition to expenses. Mr. Colvocoresses estimates that the work would not require more than two days and that the expenses would not exceed \$50.00, although both factors will depend somewhat upon the accessibility of the property, of which neither he nor I can be sure at the present time. If you wish us to employ Mr. Colvocoresses for this work, may we suggest that you send us for transmission to him a draft to his order in the amount of not less than \$125.00 to apply on his fee and expenses.

The information we give you in this letter should be regarded by you as a preliminary title report since we can be somewhat more definite after the receipt of a report from Mr. Colvocoresses, which would indicate to us whether the claims were properly located upon the ground and were therefore initially valid. With this in mind we shall retain the enclosures sent by you until the matter has been concluded.


