

JOKER MINE

October 4th, 1937

Located about 4 miles off main road between Wagoner and Minniehaha Flat.

Conference with Hugh Cuthbert and Moore (Rancher from Glendale).

An old mine from which some very high grade silver ore is said to have been taken 50 to 60 years ago. Then abandoned for many years until recently taken over by a cattle man named Morgan who obtained a long time bond and lease from the owner with purchase price set at \$30,000 and 10% royalty to apply on purchase.

Three claims in group of which only one is patented. Shaft and tunnels largely caved but Morgan opened out with some of the old workings with very little equipment and no pump and has mined above the water level and shipped some 60 tons of ore which is said to have been rich. Morgan offered to give Moore an option on his option for \$25,000 cash payment (which is crazy) and has later offered to modify these terms and take only \$1,000.00 cash.

Moore and Cuthbert visited the property and could not see that any ore was blocked out although some was shown them in the floor of the drift which cannot be mined until a pump is installed.

They sampled the vein and in one place when it was 2' wide got \$22.00 assay and another sample 4' wide ran \$9.00. The cropping and ore on dump appeared to be worthless.

Two boulders were noted in the creek and samples from these ran 300 and 440 oz. in silver and a similar grade boulder was said to have been broken up and shipped by Morgan.

These are float and may have been carried for a long distance.

Apparently the only attractive feature of the Joker is the chance of finding the lode from which the float originally came and staking claims to cover them.

Suggested to Moore that he had best grub-stake some competent prospector, if he can find one.

John Paxton knows something of this mine, also Max at Morristown.
