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



I am sorry that things turned out as they have but you must know that I could not go along with waiting for you to keep appointments that you disregarded in every respect. I never expected you to neglect your business to take care of Corporation business but I never could see why you should make appointments ~~xx~~with me and not even call when you found you could not be there. When I called you in Wikieup you told me you would be in Phoenix the following night, late, and that you would call me the next morning, you left town without calling to let me know you could not keep our appointment, a call would have not taken more than a few minutes and I would have been free to do other things that were waiting my attention, instead I lost most of the day feeling that you would keep our appointment even if it would be late. What I wanted to talk over with you was very important and involved other people that I had told you would be available the following morning. When you did not show up and I had no idea when you would I closed the deal with these people their way rather than loose any chance of dealing with them, I had to exclude you from the deal because the interested people said they would not deal with some one that did not regard his associates as important enough to at least call and give a reason for not being able to show up.

It seems that it was a way of life with you to disregard my time as of any importants. I have come to the conclusion that I must carry on without you so I have hired men to take care of the work you agreed to do for one third interest in Arizona Mining & Dredge Inc.

I had planed to turn over the operation to you very soon because I am feady to retire and do the things that cannot be done together with mining and other interests that we have.

As long as you have requested that resign from Arizona Mining and Dredge Corp. I wish you would get a letter to that affect to our lawyer together with any papers you have pertaining to the mines or maps other than maps you have made they are of no value to the present operation.

When you dropped the eight claims at Cuprite you created a serious problem because some of the dropped claims contain the better ore bodies. So all the work you have done on these claims has to be done over. If you had told me you were going to drop claims I could have shown you the claims that would not have included any of the ore.

Send your letter of resignation to Mr. Raby I will be out of town so there will be no use sending it to me. Please send it very soon because I want to close the books and start over. There are several sums of money spent that you are responsible for up to one third and this fact will remain until your resignation is accepted

Several months ago it was agreed between you and I that you would take care of mapping the copper claims and also take care of recording both with the county and B. L. M. It was also agreed that you would do the staking on the copper mine and the Buena Suerte gold claims.

I learned today that the staking has not been done and that it must be done in a matter of days or we will loose the claims.

I am going into the hospital on the sixth and expect to be out on the eighth. Not later than the tenth We will start staking the claims if you haven't already started doing it. If we have to do this work which you agreed to do there will have to be an adjustment made as to ownership of corporate interests.

Not knowing when you would be available to work with me on the ranch deal I had to turn to something that I knew would work, so I turned the deal over to a company here in Phoenix and they are going to give me a working interest for the work I have done hoping that you would be interested enough to work with me and take over when I get ready to quit which may not be too long. Getting real tired of carrying the load for everyone connected with the operation. Ruth and I just finished 16 hours of tough cat work so that the people could get to the copper mine to get samples, the heavy rains left very little of the road in some places. According to the setup as it is one third of this work was for you and you have no money or time in the work, this has to come to a halt because Ruth and I think you are playing us for a couple of suckers.

I will contact you when I get out of the hospital and I will expect you to have some answers to give me at that time.



Excerpts from the Mining Laws of the State of Arizona

Title XXXIV of the Revised Statutes of 1923, Chap. 1, and Amendments thereto.

Section 4038. Such location shall be made by erecting at or contiguous to the point of discovery a conspicuous monument of stone not less than three feet in height, or an upright post, securely fixed, projecting at least four feet above the ground, in which monument of stones or on which post there shall be posted a location notice which shall be signed by the name or names of the locator or locators.

Sec. 4030. From the time of the location of a mining claim, as above specified, the locator shall be allowed ninety days within which to do or cause to be done the following things:




