BUENA SUERTE MINING CLAIMS.

CLAIM No. ONE.

This claim is 600 ft. by 1500 ft. along the strike of the vein (South to North) and is located about one and one half miles from the town of Bumble Bee in Yavapai County, Arizona.

There is a badly caved shaft on this claim that is assumed to be about thirty feet deep this assumption was arrived at by estimating the cubic yardage in the piles of rock taken from the shaft by early-day miners.

The writer found several small particals of free gold in quarts ore piled on the dump by the early-day miners. This small amount of free gold plus history of the mine learned from residents of the era warrents further testing and it is reasonable to think the ideal way to do this testing is to go down with a core drill to a point just below the bottom of the old shaft to prove the value and amount of comercial ore at that point.

CLAIM No. TWO.

This claim is directly north of claim number one and is along the strike of the same vein. This claim is also 600ft. by 1500ft.

There is a location shaft or cut about eight feet wide by twelve feet long and about four feet, average, deep. The vein material here is identical to that of claim number one. There should be at least one coredrill hole put down at this location shaft to determin if the same conditions exist here as in the shaft on number one claim.

CLAIM No. THREE

This claim is directly north of claims number one and two and runs fifteen hundred feet along the strike of the same vein. There is a badly caved shaft on this claim however it is open enough that it was possible to make a sounding with a weighted cord that shows the shaft to be ninety feet deep with sixty feet of water that drains off through a tunnel that intersect the shaft thirty feet from the surface. An assayer that was locater in Bumble Bee for a few weeks took two grab samples of the dumps which ran ten and eleven dollars in gold and silver (Gold at 35.00 and silver at three dollars twenty nine cents per troy ounce. The local people claim the ore at the bottom of this shaft was good ore but the low price of gold and silver at that time (Gold 20.67 and silver only a few cents) made it impossible to operate. With present prices this mine could pperate at a profitable rate. There should be a diamond drill hole put down to prove the value and amount of commercial ore below the bottom of this shaft.

CLAIM ~~SHAF~~ NUMBER FOUR

There is only two or three small location holes on this claim only enough to show type of material and strike of the vein the material is identical to the claims to the south and there should be drilling done to prove values and amount of ore from the surface to one hundred feet or more into the vein.

CLAIM NUMBER FIVE

This claim is on the strike of the vein shown in the four claims to the south and the material in the vein is identical to the other claims so it would be advisable to drill one hole here and if the values are located and the ore body large enough there should be several drill holes put down along the entire course of the vein from the south boundry of claim number one to the north boundry of claim number five. This property could develope into a good commercial operation.




2. To sink a discovery shaft in the claim to a depth of at least eight feet from the lowest part of the rim of the shaft at the surface, and deeper, if necessary, until there is disclosed in said shaft mineral in place.

* * * * *

Sec. 4032. Such surface boundaries shall be marked by six substantial posts projecting at least four feet above the surface of the ground, or by substantial stone monuments at least three feet high, to-wit: One at each corner of said claim and one at the center of each end-line thereof.

Provided, however, that when the point of a monument of a mining claim is at the same point, and coincides with a monument of the survey of the United States, the monument of such government survey shall be and is hereby declared to be a mining claim monument of claims heretofore or hereafter located.

Sec. 4034. Location notices may be amended at any time and the monuments changed to correspond with the amended location; Provided, That no change shall be made that will interfere with the rights of others.



This diagram is to give locator a general idea of plan of location under the new law. The Discovery Shaft can be in the center of claim or any distance from either end desired. In the diagram it is placed 500 feet from one end, and 1000 feet from the other. Commence description of claim at a center end monument, giving its distance and direction from center of Discovery Shaft; thence bound the claim in either direction. In description be careful to state locality of claim with reference to some natural object, or permanent monument, as will identify the claim.


