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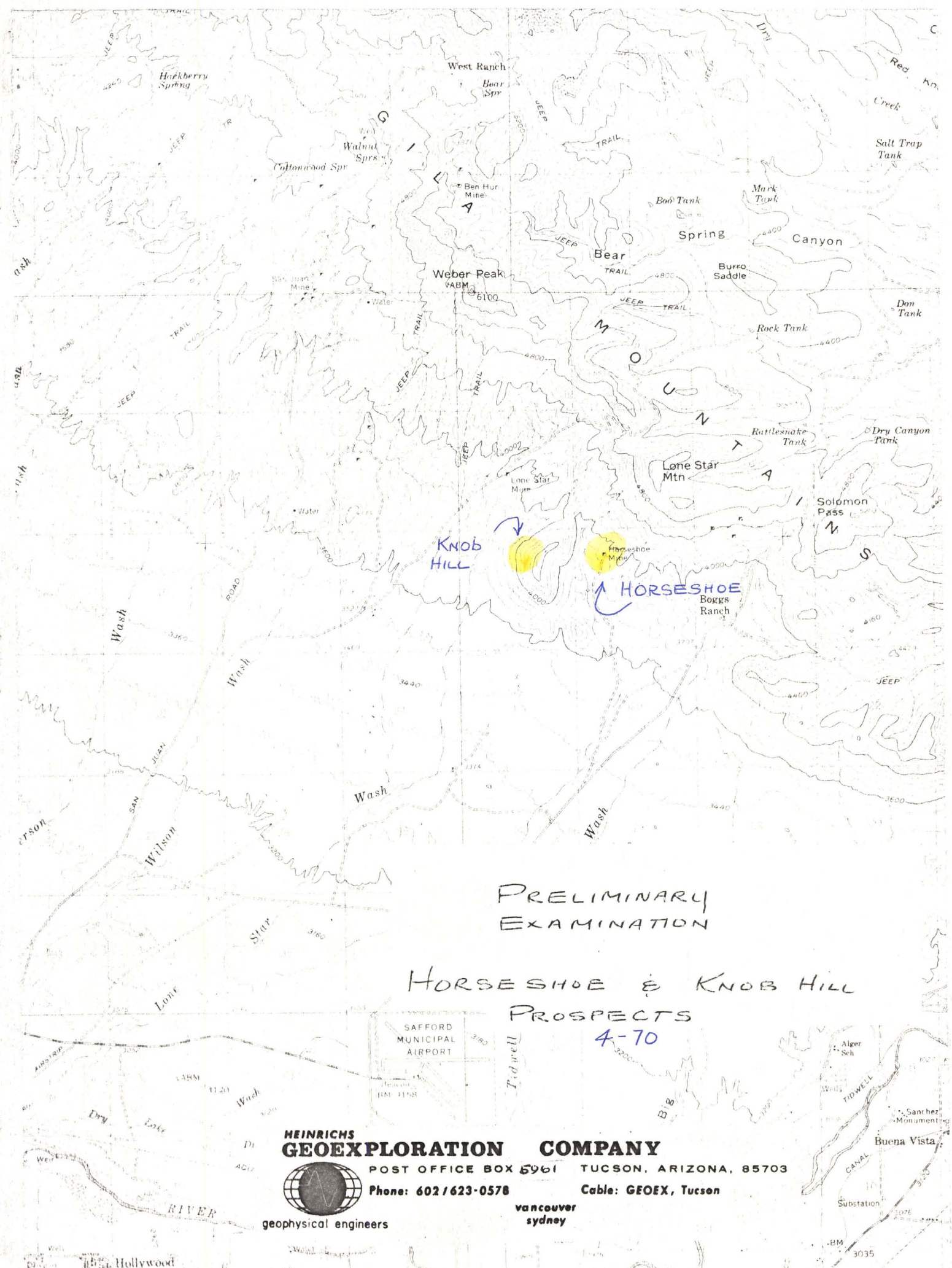

Horseshoe: Heavy red iron stained zones with small copper oxide dikes largest 4 ft. wide very high grade est. 4% numerous small copper oxide zones. Limited tonnage available. Cretaceous volcanics & sediments.

Knob Hill: Very small exposures of oxide copper.

Open cut and small stope and small adit. Limited production likely no more than +/- 100 tons of ore.

No facts. May have been one care +/- shipment. About 30 tons is stockpiled at the site.

Mining Equipment on Property: One churn drill, reportedly owned by O.L. Hill, former lessee.

Recommendations and Conclusions: The properties are very limited in area and are not contiguous. The iron staining and mineralization look interesting on the Horseshoe but wven if something economic were developed it would be necessary to negotiate with Kennecott who surround and two properties on all sides. One deep drill hole and two shallow ones would adequately test the property. Geology and geophysics should precede the drilling if done. This property would give Essex a toe hold in the district and some limited minor production could be realized and fed to Producer Minerals at San Juan. The asking price seems steep.
