The last day I was in Milford while you were at the mine with Len Wotherspoon, a Mr. Gaylon Hansen left four large samples by the door of the core shack. They came from the Copper Mountain Mine some distance south of St. George in Mohave County, Arizona, and represent small tonnages of high grade oxide and chalcocite ore. Hansen wants to know if we could accept the oxide ore at Milford and save him the additional shipping cost to a smelter.

Re; The copper ore samples herewith being submitted, are for testing as to their amenability to Shield's copper recovery process. If found to be amenable and of interest, we would wish to discuss marketing our ore production to Shields.

If not inconvenient, we would request copies of the various test results on these ore samples and a cut of the sample pulps.

We are currently in the process of setting up the mine for development and production; we will be ready to begin shipments in the near future.

Depending on the grade of ore produced, and for which market, our production should approximate 30 to 60 T.P.D. once the mine is set up. Producesable ore grade ranges up to about 15% copper.

The ore is siliceous and has been accepted, on favorable, terms for treatment at Anaconda, Montana and at Inspiration, Globe, Arizona; however, we believe that perhaps a higher return on the ore should be achieved if it can be marketed closer to "home" and thereby save some transport costs.

The several ore samples herewith submitted are approximately representative of our several ore types.

Sample # 1

general grab of the north workings, and of their waste dumps. Mostly all oxide copper minerals.

Sample # 2

general grab of the main shaft waste dumps and of the main shaft upper levels. Mostly oxide copper minerals.

Sample # 3

general grab of the waste dump from the lower levels of the main shaft workings. Mostly impure chalcocite with some oxide copper.

Sample # 5

general grab sample of the ore and waste dumps on the shallow "west" veins to the west of the main shaft. Mostly oxide copper minerals.

The mine is known as the Copper Mountain Mine and is situated in Mohave County, Arizona and is reached by traveling 92 miles by road, due south from St. George, Utah.
