Dear Mr. Jones:

Siskon Corporation has two properties, one a 249 unpatented lode mining claim property and the other consisting of 63 unpatented lode mining claims, both located in Nye County, Nevada, which appear, from the geological and geophysical work and drilling completed to date, to be very excellent prospects for large porphyry-type moly-copper deposits.

We believe the anomalies indicated in the I. P. surveys, and the results of limited drilling completed to date, indicate additional exploration and drilling would be warranted, and we are seeking a partner on a joint venture basis, or to join us on some other basis that would be mutually advantageous, to carry forward this program.

We would be interested in discussing the potential of these properties with your exploration people at your convenience.
