

Drill Hole ES-2 was advanced from 1100 feet to 2136 feet. Badly broken ground associated with fault-veins and other structures made it necessary to case the hole Nx at 2072 feet. The rock continues to be andesitic agglomerate with propylitic alteration. Pyrite occurrence is weak to moderate but very irregular in distribution. Immediately below 1300 feet oxidation is complete due to the intense fracturing. Partial oxidation continues to the bottom of the hole. Two fault-veins containing strong quartz-sericite-hematite were penetrated but neither had any visible copper although earthy cuprite may have been present. Traces of copper sulfides appeared in several places for short intervals. An interval of good disseminated chalcopyrite mineralization (approximately 1%) was logged from 2126-2129 feet with the bottom of the zone as yet undetermined because all of the core was not available.

Geologic field mapping continued on the east side of Producer Minerals property, adjacent to various claim groups under lease to Esses.

(A brief visit was made to a copper prospect owned by Milbert Elmer and Ann Chlarson of Safford. The negative report is on file.)

Raymond Godfrey contacted Esses regarding his prospect southwest of Lordsburg, New Mexico.

Leonard Adams and Noble Daniel also wish to present some claims near Wickenburg and Salome.
