
The North Star is on the east slope of the Picacho Mts., at the north end of the range near Brady Wash. I have seen it only for about 20-30 minutes in the late afternoon of 1963. There is abundant Cu stain on shear zones, and at least one Qtz. porphyry dike. Since it is at the edge of alluvial cover, it must be rated as having some interest, but the exposed area was not believed at the time (more instinctively than for any specific reason) to be a promising lead. Alteration is not pervasive and is present only in the copper stained shear zones.

In addition to this recent drilling by Canwex, there were 2 or 3 old churn holes put down in the 50's, although I can't recall that I saw these in the field.

The copper, occurring at an alluvial margin, invites speculation-- I have just never done any more about examining it.







**VERTICAL SECTION
