Dear Sir:

You are being sent herewith a certificate showing that you have taken the oxygen breathing apparatus training given by the Bureau of Mines. However, this certificate is marked "Not qualified to wear oxygen breathing apparatus at mine fires or mine explosions" because of limitations determined during physical examinations and tests conducted preliminary to your training. Experience has shown that it is dangerous for any person who is not physically sound and fit to perform arduous work while wearing respiratory protective equipment and, moreover, that the lives of fellow crew members are likely to be jeopardized.

This recommendation that you do not wear oxygen breathing apparatus at mine fires or mine explosions in no way reflects on your knowledge, experience, previous training, or the manner in which you took the training; in fact, this training is likely to be of much value in the event of a mine disaster.

The Bureau requires that persons eligible to receive standard unqualified certificates shall have the following personal and physical qualifications: Be between 18 and 50 years of age; be physically sound; conform within 10 percent to a standard table of heights and weights; have at least 20/40 uncorrected vision in each eye, or 20/50 in one eye with 20/30 or better in the other eye; have good hearing in each ear and be able to hear ordinary conversation at a distance of at least 20 feet; have no detachable bridges or plates, and have at least four natural canine and bicuspid teeth or nondetachable bridges in lieu thereof; have a normal chest, with expansion of not less than 2-1/2 inches; a normal nose, throat, lungs, and heart; a pulse less than 100 beats a minute and not over two beats higher than normal after two minutes rest following exercise; be free from abdominal weakness or evidence of hernia; not to have more than two fingers missing on either hand; and be of a cool, calm disposition, capable of sustained, strenuous work.

In accordance with these regulations a qualified certificate is issued for the following reason or reasons: not physically sound and underweight.


