

Dear Mr. Heinrichs :

In reply to your letter of the 3/24 , - let me state again that I have one(1) very good claim in the Cave creek Mining District and two, very good claims in the Vulture Mining District; and they are all on Federal land .

There are many , good out-croppings on all my claims and they are all very rich in mineralization, showing as much as 50 % copper, 7.5 oz. silver plus a good showing of gold , all per ton of ore ; and I think that you will agree that this is darned , good , rich ore (exceptionally rich) and worth looking into. Also it came right out of the veins and was not hand picked; every vein that I have checked, showed good mineralization.

Also I wonder if there could be a very rich and large deposit of ore some where down underneath with ore this rich and I would think that it would be advisable to do some core drilling in the area to find out.

You know that there was a similar situation in Canada some years back, near Timmins, Ontario ; Gulf-Texas went in and core drilled the area and as a result, they found very large deposits of ore down underneath , - all very rich and with millions of tons of copper, silver, gold, etc. There was big write-ups in a number of magazines about it at the time.

I am also thinking about Occidental Minerals Corporation discovering this large body of ore under the town of Miami, Arizona , - a 100-million ton of oxide copper , underlies the town at a depth ranging from 1,100 to 2,000 feet; this ore has an average grade of only about one-half percent. Occidental has already spent \$11 million on exploration and they plan on spending another \$16 million within the next year or so. You probably are aware of all this.

Samples for assaying were taken right out of the veins and samples were taken from the top down, to a depth in some places of 30 feet and the ore held up good at all points . I used several pounds for each assay.

I hope that you will give this your careful thought and then take a look at these claims with me and if you like , get yourself some samples, etc. You know , I won't charge you to look , " as the saying goes " and it might just pay off.

I have a "hunch" that there is a very large ,pocket of ore down underneath some where in the area and maybe that is where all these ,many outcroppings came from where the earth was hot , millions of years ago and it then spewed some of it out to the surface;please ,think this over.

All these outcroppings are in an area of mile,or less , square.

Many,many years ago , there was some mining in the area ; one mine was quite extensive .

As far as leasing the property or with an option to purchase , I would be happy to consider anything within reason ,- the customary terms,etc. I would be fair with you and you would be fair with me ,in regard to this ; the main thing is to get the property going ; I am getting up in years ; and I can't live forever so I am anxious to get something going soon ; I would be glad to consider rents or royalties and later on an outright purchase price.

I will help you in anyway that I can to check out and get these properties developed and going.

As of this date , no other competent and experienced ,exploration people have seen these claims or checked them out.

In regard to the legal location of the Vulture claims, they are way back in the sticks and off the beaten pass ; as a result, I do not at present have a legal description of same . However,I got a good map of Maricopa county and I marked on this map the location of the claims for the Bureau of Land Management and they accepted same; they made a Xerox copy of this map for their records. We can, however, get the legal description later ,if it is desirable to have same,I am sure.

I hope to hear from you very soon .




Dear Mr. Dean:

Thanks for the added details regarding your Manna from Heaven Mining Claim and Vulture District Claims.

In order to expedite the development and appraisal of our possible interest in your various mineral interests, the information you have sent is good, and helpful, but is still not specific enough for scheduling an examination. Part of the reason for that is that everyone is extremely busy right now and nothing else is going on right now in your area.

Technically you have explained what the assayed samples do not represent, but absolutely crucial, is exactly how were they taken, the total amount of material in each sample (pounds) and, in detail of feet and inches. In other words, precisely what does the sample represent with respect to the vein, zone of mineralization, or apparent mineralized structure as it is commonly referred to geologically? Without such information, the samples can only be representative of some "character or quality" of the vein or structure and are apt to be meaningless as to the true economic potential involved.

Another matter of course is, assuming that we became interested enough to schedule an examination, did examine and were still interested then, what sort of lease and or option to purchase terms are you seeking? That factor also will have bearing on the degree of interest we might be able to develop. For example, time for evaluation at no cost, costs after that, i.e. rents or royalties, and finally, an ultimate outright purchase price.

If you are uncertain about some of these aspects, we can be of assistance, but you also will need to help us in the process. Incidentally, have other competent, experienced exploration people seen the properties and if so, what have been their comments. What is the legal location of the Vulture claims? I have spent several times over quite an area in this District - so far without much success.

We will look to hear more from you.



Dear Mr. Dean:

Thank you for your submittal letter of 20 February 1980.

Before we could determine our possible interest in your properties we would first need to learn of their location. Of course, location is not always a final criterion, but part of our interest may depend on whether or not we are familiar with the areas involved.

Another important factor is the technical description of the location and type of sample in order to gauge what the material you describe as "run of the mill" might actually represent. In other words, does it represent a channel sample taken across the structure? Does it represent random pieces picked up from the surface over a large area? Is it material simply grabbed from a dump at the surface of a shaft or at the portal of an adit? Without knowing these things we can place no significant whatsoever on the assays that you have taken except that obviously some mineralization is present. Obviously, whether or not such material could be mined at a profit and how much is in reserve is entirely a different matter.

We may be able to help both technically as well as financially depending on the circumstances and the details.

We will look forward to hearing from you further.


