ADDENDUM TO CONTRACT DATED 20TH day of MARCH, 1966 AND ANY
PRIOR OR SUBSEQUENT AGREEMENTS

This indenture, made this the 16th day of December, 1968, by and between Joseph Akren, individually and as administrator of the estate of Joseph Akren, deceased, acting for Carolyn E. Stevens, Thomas Akren and Jerry M. Akren, as heirs and devisees of said estate, party of the first part, by and between TEXAS Metallic Mines, Inc. of Waco, Texas, party of the second part, assignee of the interest of Joseph Thompson under one certain agreement dated the 20th day of March, 1966, and recorded in Docket 449, Page 495, of the records of the State of Arizona, County of Pinal.

WITNESSETH:

1.

That parties of the first part and parties of the second part for and in consideration of \$1.00, to them in hand paid, the receipt and sufficiency whereof is hereby acknowledged, and the further benefits to be derived by them by development of the properties covered in the original indenture agreement, being 38½ unpatented mining claims located near Cochran, Arizona, in Pinal County, agree as follows that the terms of Paragraph 7(c), hereinafter set out as follows:

With respect to production for the one-year period starting with the month of November 1, 1967, and then thereafter, party of the second part agrees to pay parties of the first part a minimum royalty of \$500.00, per month. That the terms of said paragraph shall be waived for the period of November, 1968, December, 1968, and January, 1969; That beginning with February 15, 1969, the terms of Paragraph 7(c) shall continue in full force and effect.

2.

That insofar as the terms of Paragraph 6 state 10% of the gross production from said properties, that this paragraph shall be amended to read 10% of the net smelter returns. That this amendment shall relate only to the percentages stated.

3.

That insofar as the terms of Paragraph 2 state \$250,000.00 that said paragraph be amended to read \$300,000.00, and that the final date for the balance of said payment be extended to such time as the full \$300,000.00, shall be paid in full.

4.

Parties hereto agree to waive permanently the terms of Paragraph 9, of said indenture agreement, dated 20th March, 1966, and heretofore described, insofar as the following terms are concerned:

As a perpetual royalty, the party of the second part hereby agrees to pay to the parties of the first part the sum of 1½% (one and one-half per cent) of gross sales of all minerals, metals and other ore mined and sold from said premises. This perpetual royalty shall be payable on or before the 15th day of each month, with respect to minerals, metals and other ore sold during the preceding month, commencing the first month after the payment of the purchase price of \$250,000.00.

III.

Parties further agree that in the event any of the heretofore agreements set out herein are in conflict with any other Paragraph of said indenture agreement Dated the 20th day of March, 1966, that the terms thereof shall be considered as changed to agree with this Addendum to said contract.

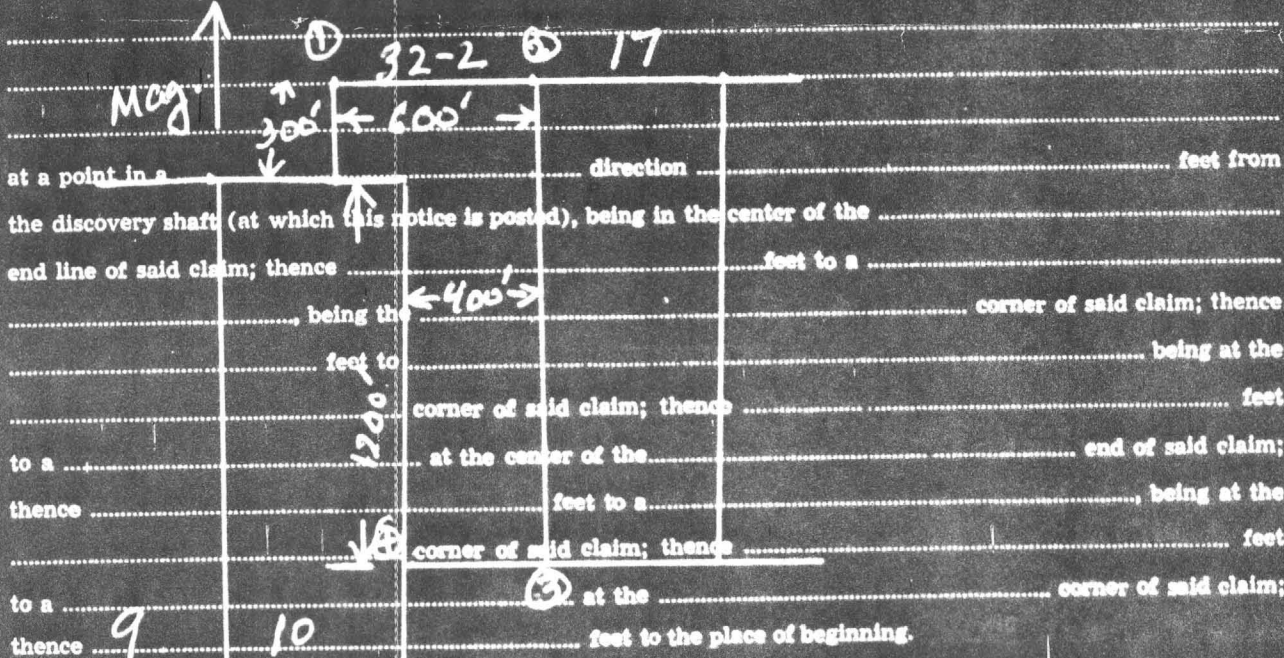

RE: Analysis of Withdrawals

You have requested that I review and analyze for legal effect certain documents pertaining to certain withdrawal procedures affecting land in Twps. 3 and 4 S., R 12 E, Gila and Salt River Meridian, Arizona, and that I make recommendation with respect to procedure to be followed in action directed toward restoration of the land concerned to availability under the mining laws and procedure for acquisition for mineral purposes.

You have submitted the following material for examination:

1. Cover letter dated July 20, 1970
2. Maps X, A, B and C prepared by your office
3. Land status plat of the concerned area
4. Copy of request for withdrawal dated December 17, 1930, Public Land Order '141 of June 16, 1943, Powersite classification number 438 of November 16, 1956, and Public Land Order 3835 of September 27, 1965.

The material set forth below is submitted in response to your request.

I. Request For Withdrawal of December 17, 1930

A. Content

1. Identification

a. The office of origin was the Department of Indian Affairs of the Department of Interior

b. File designation--Irrigation, 56368-28, 56524-30,
ALW

c. Approved by the first Assistant Secretary of Interior as of January 24, 1931

d. Segregation from appropriation was noted as of March 24, 1931

2. Purpose: The stated purpose was protection of interests of the Indians and of the United States in connection with the San Carlos Reservoir, the San Carlos Project and for use in connection with the San Carlos Indian Irrigation Project.

B. Authority: The withdrawal was requested under authority of the Act of June 25, 1910 (36 Stat. L. 847), as amended by the Act of August 24, 1912 (37 Stat. L. 497)

a. The statutes concerned now appear as 43 U.S.C.A. §§141 and 142. Such statutes provide, in material respect, as follows:

§141: "The President may, at any time in his discretion, temporarily withdraw from settlement, location, sale, or entry any of the public lands of the United States, including Alaska, and reserve the same for water-power sites, irrigation, classification of lands, or other public purposes to be specified in the orders of withdrawals, and such withdrawals or reservations shall remain in force until revoked by him or by an Act of Congress. June 25, 1910, c. 421, §1, 36 Stat. 847."

§142: "All lands withdrawn under the provisions of this section and section 141 of this title shall at all times be open to exploration, discovery, occupation, and purchase under the mining laws of the United States, so far as the same apply to metalliferous minerals: . . ."

b. The power of the President to make withdrawals has been upheld and affirmed (U.S. v. Midwest Oil Company, 35 S. Ct. 309, 236 U.S. 459)

c. The action of the Secretary of Interior has been held to be tantamount to the Act of the President (Wilbur vs. U. S. ex rel Barton, 46 F. 2d 217, 60 App. D. C. 11, aff'd. 51 S. Ct. 502, 283, U. S. 414)

d. Under regulations presently applicable a request for withdrawal segregates the land from further entry (43 C.F.R. 2311.1-2(a))

e. The segregative effect of the regulation arises out of necessity. Earlier requests were accorded the same effect, in accordance with the order appearing on and appended to the request concerned.

C. Evaluation

1. The request having been based upon the Act of 1910, as amended, and that Act by its terms having no effect to prevent location for metalliferous minerals, it would appear that the segregative effect of the request for withdrawal does not preclude entry and location for metalliferous minerals

2. Necessity is presented to make determination of:

a. The present status of the request, whether revoked, cancelled or still in effect

b. The significance and present status of the San Carlos Indian Irrigation Project and Reservoir

II. Public Land Order 141 of June 16, 1943

A. Content

1. Identification

a. Published Federal Register June 24, 1943, Vol. 8, No. 124; Doc. 43-10020.

b. Serial (?) Ariz. 1944079

2. Purpose and Effect

a. The lands concerned are withdrawn and reserved under authority of the Secretary of Interior for use in connection with the San Carlos Indian Irrigation Project

b. The lands are withdrawn from all form of appropriation

3. Total land affected is 1913.57 acres

B. Authority

1. Authority for the withdrawal is E. O. 9337 of April 24, 1943. That order provides:

"By virtue of the authority vested in me by the act of June 25, 1910, ch. 421, 36 Stat. 847, and as President of the United States, it is ordered as follows:

Section 1. The Secretary of the Interior is hereby authorized to withdraw or reserve lands of the public domain and other lands owned or controlled by the United States to the same extent that such lands might be withdrawn or reserved by the President, and also, to the same extent, to modify or revoke withdrawals or reservations of such lands: Provided, That all orders of the Secretary of the Interior issued under the authority of this order shall have the prior approval of the Director of the Bureau of the Budget and the Attorney General, as now required with respect to proposed Executive orders by Executive Order No. 7298 of February 18, 1936, and shall be submitted to the Division of the Federal Register for filing and publication: Provided, further, That no such order which affects lands under the administrative jurisdiction of any executive department or agency of the Government, other than the Department of the Interior, shall be issued by the Secretary of the Interior without the prior concurrence of the head of the department or agency concerned.

Section 2. This order supersedes Executive Order No. 9146 of April 24, 1942, entitled "Authorizing the Secretary of the Interior to Withdraw and Reserve Public Lands."

C. Evaluation

1. The authority of the Secretary of Interior to take the action concerned is established
2. Approvals of the Director of the Budget and the Attorney General are required. Such approvals do not appear on the face of the order. If present, they should be reflected in the file of the proceedings.
3. The authority for the request for withdrawal, and that for the Public Land Order, are substantially different. Substantial difference appears in the acreage involved. These facts, together with the time difference--some twelve years--indicate occurrence of material proceedings between the one and the other. Significant, also, is the fact that over that period of time interest in the same project continued.

4. The land affected by the Public Land Order within the indicated area of interest is contiguous but in addition to and outside of the land described in the request for withdrawal. Such land areas, also, are disconnected tracts; some indication may thus be present that use for specific purposes was intended.

III. Powersite Classification No. 438 of November 16, 1956

A. Content

1. Identification

- a. No evidence appears of publication in the Federal Register
- b. Serial (?) 60334
- c. The classification issued out of the Geologic Survey of the Department of Interior

2. Purpose and Effect

- a. The land concerned is classified as Powersites
- b. Effect of the classification is as indicated in the statutes set forth below

B. Authority

1. Authority for the classification is stated as the Act of March 3, 1879 (20 stat. 394, 43 U.S.C.A. §31)

a. That Act is:

"(a) The Director of the Geological Survey, which office is established, under the Interior Department, shall be appointed by the President by and with the advice and consent of the Senate. This officer shall have the direction of the Geological Survey, and the classification of the public lands and examination of the geological structure, mineral resources, and products of the national domain. The Director and members of the Geological Survey shall have no personal or private interests in the lands or mineral wealth of the region under survey, and shall execute no surveys or examinations for private parties or corporations."

2. Further authority is stated as D. O. No. 2333 of June 10, 1947

a. That order is:

"§4.623 Power site classifications, modifications, and revocations. Effective immediately, the Director of the Geological Survey is authorized, without prior Secretarial approval, to classify public domain lands as power sites valuable for power purposes and to modify or revoke such classifications. (R.S. 161, 20 Stat. 394, sec. 24, 41 Stat. 1075, as amended, 5 U.S.C., sec. 22, 43 U.S.C., sec. 31, 16 U.S.C., Supp. V, sec. 818)"

C. Evaluation

1. The land concerned embraces substantially all of the land contained in the request of December 17, 1930. It includes, further, substantially all of the land withdrawn under PLO 141. It includes additional lands contiguous to those two other areas.

2. It appears to be established, by 43 C.F.R. 2022.1 (1967), that a classification under the Act of 1879 has the effect of withdrawing lands under §24 of the Federal Power Act of 1920 (16 U.S.C.A. §818). That act provides:

"Any lands of the United States included in any proposed project under the provisions of sections 792, 793, 795-818, and 820-823 of this title shall from the date of filing of application therefor be reserved from entry, location, or other disposal under the laws of the United States until otherwise directed by the commission or by Congress. Notice that such application has been made, together with the date of filing thereof and a description of the lands of the United States affected thereby, shall be filed in the local land office for the district in which such lands are located. Whenever the commission shall determine that the value of any lands of the United States so applied for, or heretofore or hereafter reserved or classified as power sites, will not be injured or destroyed for the purposes of power development by location, entry, or selection under the public-land laws, the Secretary of the Interior, upon notice of such determination, for such purpose or purposes and under such restrictions as the Commission may determine, subject to and with a reservation of the right of the United States or its permittees or licensees to enter upon, occupy, and use any part or all of said lands necessary, in the judgment of the Commission, for the purposes of sections 792, 793, 795-818, and 820-823 of this title, which right shall be expressly reserved in every patent issued for such lands; and no claim or right to compensation shall accrue from the occupation or use of any of said lands for said purposes. The United States or any licensee for any such lands hereunder may enter thereupon for the purposes of sections 792, 793, 795-818, and 820-823 of this title, upon payment of any damages to crops, buildings, or

other improvements caused thereby to the owner thereof, or upon giving a good and sufficient bond to the United States for the use and benefit of the owner to secure the payment of such damages as may be determined and fixed in an action brought upon the bond in a court of competent jurisdiction, said bond to be in the form prescribed by the Commission: Provided, That locations, entries, selections, or filings heretofore made for lands reserved as water-power sites, or in connection with water-power development, or electrical transmission may proceed to approval or patent under and subject to the limitations and conditions in this section contained: Provided further, That before any lands applied for, or heretofore or hereafter reserved, or classified as power sites, are declared open to location, entry, or selection by the Secretary of the Interior, notice of intention to make such declaration shall be given to the Governor of the State within which such lands are located, and such State shall have ninety days from the date of such notice within which to file, under any statute or regulation applicable thereto, an application for the reservation to the State, or any political subdivision thereof, of any lands required as a right-of-way for a public highway or as a source of materials for the construction and maintenance of such highways, and a copy of such application shall be filed with the Federal Power Commission; and any location, entry, or selection of such lands, or subsequent patent thereof, shall be subject to any rights granted the State pursuant to such application. June 10, 1920, c. 285, §24, 41 Stat. 1075; Aug. 26, 1935, c. 687, Title II, §211, 49 Stat. 846; May 28, 1948, c. 351, 62 Stat. 275."

3. Powersite withdrawals are subject to the provisions of the Mining Claim Rights Restoration Act of 1955 (30 U.S.C.A. §621). The provisions here applicable are:

"(a) All public lands belonging to the United States heretofore, now or hereafter withdrawn or reserved for power development or power sites shall be open to entry for location and patent of mining claims and for mining, development, beneficiation, removal, and utilization of the mineral resources of such lands under applicable Federal statutes: Provided, That all power rights to such lands shall be retained by the United States: Provided further, That locations made under this chapter within the revested Oregon and California Railroad and reconveyed Coos Bau Wagon grant lands shall also be subject to the provisions of the Act of April 8, 1948, Public Law 477 (Eightieth Congress, second session): And provided further, That nothing contained herein shall be construed to open for the purposes described in this section any lands (1) which are included in any project operating or being constructed under a license or permit issued under the Federal Power Act or other Act of Congress, or (2) which are under examination and survey by a prospective licensee of the Federal Power Commission, if such prospective licensee holds an uncanceled preliminary permit issued

under the Federal Power Act authorizing him to conduct such examination and survey with respect to such lands and such permit has not been renewed in the case of such prospective licensee more than once."

a. Further provisions material to such locations are set forth in 30 U.S.C.A. §§622-625.

IV. Public Land Order 3835 of September 27, 1965

A. Content

1. Identification

a. Serial, Ariz. No. 017239, published F. R. October 2, 1965, Vol. 30, No. 191, Doc. 65-10482

2. Purpose and Effect

- a. The stated purpose is in aid of the proposed Buttes Dam and Reservoir, Middle Gila River Project
- b. The stated effect is to render the lands subject to the Reclamation Laws and to remove them from availability under the Mining Laws.

B. Authority

1. Authority for the action is stated as being Sec. 3 of the Act of June 17, 1902, as amended and supplemented

C. Evaluation

1. The land concerned includes all of the land contained in the projects above set forth and substantial additional land contiguous to the south

2. Sec. 3 of the Act of June 17, 1902 (43 U.S.C.A. Sec. 416) provides:

"The Secretary of the Interior shall, before giving the public notice provided for in section 419 of this title, withdraw from public entry the lands required for any irrigation works contemplated under the provisions of sections 372, 373, 381, 391, 411, 416, 421, 431, 432, 439, 461, 491, and 498 of this title, and shall restore to public entry any of the lands so withdrawn when, in his judgment, such lands are not required for the purposes of such sections; and the Secretary of the Interior is hereby authorized, at or immediately prior to the time of beginning the surveys for any contemplated irrigation works, to withdraw from entry, except under the homestead laws, any public lands believed to be susceptible of

irrigation from said works: Provided, That all lands entered and entries made under the homestead laws within areas so withdrawn during such withdrawal shall be subject to all the provisions, limitations, charges, terms, and conditions of such sections; that said surveys shall be prosecuted diligently to completion, and upon the completion thereof, and of the necessary maps, plans, and estimates of cost, the Secretary of the Interior shall determine whether or not said project is practicable and advisable, and if determined to be impracticable or unadvisable he shall thereupon restore said lands to entry. June 17, 1902, c. 1093, §3, 32 Stat. 388."

- a. Interpretation has been made that withdrawals accomplished under provision above made for "irrigation works" constitutes "first form" withdrawals rendering the land unavailable for any inconsistent appropriation, that those made of "lands susceptible of irrigation" constitute "second form" withdrawals and that the latter were open to mineral location. It is a tenable proposition, though not free from all doubt at present, that to the extent that the withdrawal concerned is a "second form" withdrawal, the lands remain open for location.
3. Attention is directed to that language of the above statute making mandatory restoration by the Secretary of lands so withdrawn when "in his judgment" such lands are not required for the purposes withdrawn.
4. In further connection with such withdrawal the following statute is applicable (43 U.S.C.A. §154):

"Where public lands of the United States have been withdrawn for possible use for construction purposes under the Federal reclamation laws, and are known or believed to be valuable for minerals and would, if not so withdrawn, be subject to location and patent under the general mining laws, the Secretary of the Interior, when in his opinion the rights of the United States will not be prejudiced thereby, may, in his discretion, open the land to location, entry, and patent under the general mining laws, reserving such ways, rights, and easements over or to such lands as may be prescribed by him and as may be deemed necessary or appropriate, including the right to take and remove from such lands construction materials for use in the construction of irrigation works, and/or the said Secretary may require the execution of a

contract by the intending locator or entryman as a condition precedent to the vesting of any rights in him, when in the opinion of the Secretary same may be necessary for the protection of the irrigation interests. Such reservation or contract rights may be in favor of the United States or irrigation concerns cooperating or contracting with the United States and operating in the vicinity of such lands. The Secretary may prescribe the form of such contract which shall be executed and acknowledged and recorded in the county records and United States local land office by any locator or entryman of such land before any rights in their favor attach thereto, and the locator or entryman executing such contract shall undertake such indemnifying covenants and shall grant such rights over such lands as in the opinion of the Secretary may be necessary for the protection of Federal or private irrigation in the vicinity. Notice of such reservation or of the necessity of executing such prescribed contract shall be filed in the Bureau of Land Management and in the appropriate local land office, and notations thereof shall be made upon the appropriate tract books, and any location or entry thereafter made upon or for such lands, and any patent therefor shall be subject to the terms of such contract and/or to such reserved ways, rights, or easements and such entry or patent shall contain a reference thereto.

The Secretary of the Interior may prescribe such rules and regulations as may be necessary to enable him to enforce the provisions of this section. Apr. 23, 1932, c. 134, §§ 1, 2, 47 Stat. 136, 137; 1946 Reorg. Plan No. 3, § 403, eff. July 16, 1946, 11 F.R. 7876, 60 Stat. 1100."

V. Evaluation Summary

A. On the basis of the material above set forth, the following propositions are tenable:

1. The request for withdrawal of December 17, 1930 having been made under the Act of June 25, 1910, the lands are available for location for metalliferous minerals.
2. The above request may have been superseded by procedure leading to Public Land Order 141
3. Public Land Order 141 was made for purposes then deemed meritorious but possibly of no present and continuing vitality and effect.
4. The Powersite classification of November 16, 1956 may be invalid for lack of approvals prescribed as requisite.
5. Existence of the request for withdrawal and Public Land

Order 141 raise question of the effect of the Powersite classification.

6. Assuming validity of the Powersite classification, under the Rights Restoration Act of 1955, the entire area would be open to location at that point.

7. Public Land Order 3835 of September 27, 1965 is of questionable effect by virtue of the prior existence of the Powersite classification.

8. If it is of effect, the land may be available for location as a second-form withdrawal under the Reclamation Laws.

9. If the land is not available for location, statutory provision is made for (a) concurrent use for mining purposes, (b) restoration to availability by action of the Secretary under applicable statutes

10. The conditions revealed present such a state of administrative and procedural confusion that it is to the interest of both the Bureau of Land Management and the public that such conditions be clarified.

a. In this respect the following material from the report of the Public Land Law Review Commission may be of interest:

"At present virtually all of the public domain in all 50 states has been withdrawn from entry under one or more of the public land laws. Approximately 264 million acres are withdrawn under specific orders for particular purposes. Some 163 million acres were withdrawn in 1934 and 1935 in the 11 contiguous western states to implement the Taylor Grazing Act. Early in 1969 entries and state selection of the public lands in Alaska were suspended for a period of two years to enable Congress to consider legislation to resolve the problem of native claims.

We experienced great difficulty in trying to determine with any precision the extent of existing Executive withdrawals and the degree to which withdrawals overlap each other. We have found that the agencies do not have accurate records that show the purposes for which specific areas have been withdrawn and the uses that can be made of such areas under the public land laws.

A complete review of all existing withdrawals should be undertaken immediately to provide a basis for eliminating those that no longer serve a useful purpose, and for modifying those that are unnecessarily large in scope and area. This is a necessary step to "free" the public lands of encumbrances to effective land use planning for the future. It should be carried out as the initial effort under the formal withdrawal review program we recommend later in this chapter. In the opinion of the Commission 10 years is a reasonable time for a review of all existing withdrawals and rejustification for renewal of those found to be required. Consequently, we recommend that all existing withdrawals terminate at the end of a 10-year period unless expressly effected as new withdrawals under the laws and procedures we recommend."

B. Enforcement of the above propositions by means of litigation or direct confrontation would entail, of necessity, time and expense sufficiently substantial to be destructive of the objective sought to be accomplished.

C. The above review reveals the necessity of obtaining further information. Necessary information would include (1) records of background, procedure and present status of the several proceedings (2) present status of the concerned projects (3) evidence on the ground of any activities attributable to any of the several projects

1. A comprehensive review of the records would require examination of files in Washington, particularly with respect to the two earlier proceedings. Such a review may not be necessary for present purposes. Information obtained on local levels should be obtained and may be found to be sufficient.

VI. Recommended Procedure

A. Obtaining of Information

1. Search should be made of concerned records in Pinal County and in the offices of the Bureau of Land Management and the Bureau of Reclamation in Phoenix.
2. Examination should be made of the ground and the immediate area for existence of work attributable to any of the projects.

B. Evaluation

1. Evaluation should be made of information obtained in relation to its effect upon the analysis above set forth

C. Mineral Evaluation

1. To the extent possible, mineral evaluation of the area of interest should proceed with dispatch

2. In any discussions with the Bureau of Land Management the boundaries of the desired area will be material. Those boundaries should be determined as soon as possible.

D. Appropriation of Desired Area

1. The analysis above set forth provides reasonable basis for good-faith belief that the lands may be presently available for location. Prior activities and apparent mineral activity in the general area indicate that the potential deposits may not be unknown. Precluding appropriation by third parties would appear to be advisable.

At the same time, action which might precipitate contest of claims before rights have been matured should be avoided. Consideration should, therefore, be given at the earliest feasible date to (1) delineation of the perimeter of the desired area (2) preliminary location of claims to cover the area (3) giving of notice of such action to the Bureau of Land Management with reasonable explanation for reasons for such action and expression of intent to discuss the problems involved with their office

E. Negotiations with Bureau of Land Management

1. As soon as necessary information has been gathered and evaluated and pertinent factors placed in perspective, conference should be held with the Bureau of Land Management in Phoenix to enlist the assistance and the cooperation of that office in solution of the problem. If the deposits believed to be present should prove to be sufficiently substantial to provide basis for operations capital


