



HISTORY AND SUMMARY OF TOMBSTONE CLAIMS
and
POTENTIAL FOR JOINT VENTURE PARTNER
September 1, 1989

The known production at Tombstone in terms of current metal prices is \$104 million gold, \$198 million silver, \$32.5 million lead, \$3.375 million copper, and \$825,000 zinc, totaling \$338,700,000. As an indication of the future potential at Tombstone, in spring, 1988, Santa Fe Mining began drilling deep (3,500') holes on ground adjacent to the JABA, Inc. claims. Encouraging results or geological conditions appear to have been obtained since Santa Fe Mining is continuing to drill in the area, and at least as much again, as has been produced in the past would reasonably be required to justify Santa Fe's continuing interest.

James A. Briscoe, President of JABA, Inc., first started studying the district in 1972, and in 1980, on his recommendation of good economic potential, Tombstone Exploration, Inc. opened the Contention open pit mine, which has been reported to have produced in excess of \$15 million in gold and silver before closing in 1983. Upon the incorporation of JABA, Inc. in 1981, Jim Briscoe brought to the corporation data from both his geologic studies as well as studies of others that he had compiled since 1972. Since that time, JABA, Inc. has continued to study the district and gather and assemble information, resulting in the belief that their holdings in the District have a near surface capability of an aggregate value at current metal prices of approximately \$680 million, with deeper seated reserve potential of \$3 billion.

JABA, Inc. currently holds 171 mining claims in the Tombstone Mining District. In order to raise the necessary capital to do technical studies, drilling, and ore reserve definition, to ultimately bring this property fruition, it is JABA, Inc.'s intention to Joint Venture the property as a means of acquiring the necessary funds.

The venture capital partner has options in the course of the "partnership", each affecting his rate of return differently. Assuming measured reserves of \$100 million are "indicated" through Activity I. and II. of the T.S. Claims Joint Venture totaling a \$2 million requirement, at the point in time that only \$200,000 has been invested, the venture partner would have a 4.99% interest in the property, or a gross value of \$4,990,000, or 24 times his investment in 6 months. The marketability of this investment is obviously not the full \$4.99 million, since a great deal of work needs to be done to obtain "measured" reserves. However, his interest is saleable/bankable. Should he choose to continue the funding through Activity III, his subsequent 49.9% interest would yield a gross value of \$49.9 million.

JABA would provide the mining property, exploration data, exploration program design and execution, and all data and reports therefrom. The Funder would provide \$2,000,000 in exploration cash. JABA would manage.

Development of a minable ore body, under current price and technological conditions. At the end of the exploration program reserves would have been determined, a mining and business plan made, and the property would be bankable/saleable.

Commitment of the full \$2,000,000 is required to earn vested ownership. The earn in shall be as follows:

Each expenditure of \$40,000 shall earn a 1% interest in the property, after vesting. JABA reserves the right to terminate further work on the property if geologic and/or engineering parameters suggest that a profitable ore body cannot be drilled out. If JABA terminates work on the project as described above, the Funder would become vested and ownership in the property would be proportional to the money expended at the date of termination. For example: After the expenditure of \$240,000, negative data were obtained and JABA terminated the project. Ownership in the claims would be:

Funder: \$240,000 - \$40,000 per 1% = 6%
JABA, Inc.: 94%

JABA would provide the opportunity for the Funder to expend remaining monies on another high-potential property. The expenditure of the remaining funds would earn a 49.9% interest in that property.

If the Funder for any reason failed to provide the full \$2,000,000 in exploration capital, the Funder would not become vested, and therefore, the interest earned would be zero.



Dear Mr. Briscoe:

I really enjoyed our discussion this past Tuesday, and I certainly view your comments, experience, and situation with the highest regard. It appears that there may be a true and worthwhile basis for us to work together for our mutual benefit. Provided that the Forward Gold Metal Program can be authenticated to my satisfaction, I plan to participate in my broker role with the utmost dilligence, energy, and perseverance. And for now, I will move ahead on the assumption that this program has the validity and merit as represented to me.

I include for your perusal, excerpts from my associate Nancy's tele-fax to me on 12/30/89, followed by the FGMP Procedures.

Quote:

With respect to your comments on the bullion, we are interested. As you are aware, we represent and are signatory for one of the largest contract Buyers, and are direct to the others, whom our Buyer, dependent on its' obligations may work with, and/or joint-venture with at times. In this regards, we are extremely interested in purchasing any gold you may have available, subject to suitable terms and conditions. With reference to mine owners, we have recently become more active in this area. Those owners who have approached us normally require funds for equipment and to increase production. Our Buyer(s) is willing under this scenario to advance the funds, as long as it is repaid in full within a year's term from the gold production. In addition, it would expect a 110% supply bond from an AA rated insurance company, or a declining letter of credit from a major bank guaranteeing its performance. Plus it would look at a five year contract to purchase the entire gold production from the mine(s), at a discount of usually twenty percent (20%).

When considering that most mine owners to secure funds, develop a prospectus and thereafter seek investors in the range of \$1,000 to \$10,000, it could take hundreds of investors and years before they are in a position to proceed. And when, such investors normally receive 40% to 60% of the production of all metals from the mine, (then) that requested by our Buyer becomes more attractive.

However, we have found that most banks and insurance companies are not interested in offering such guarantees, unless it is supported by other assets of the mine owners, such as real estate, etc.

Due to the above, we have recently been in negotiations with one corporation who appears receptive to hypothecating its property, and through our's and our Buyer's offices - arranging a loan against its' property, as well as the mine owners, whereby the mine production would repay the interest and principal. In exchange, an equity position would be requested (20% to 25%) plus a contract by our Buyer to purchase the gold production only, as referenced above.

As noted, we are presently in the process of arranging some under the above synopsis, and if you have a mine in production - whom you feel would be interested, please let us know.

If however, the mine owners do (not) need additional funds, but the security of a Buyer, this would be handled in a different manner. If the product is delivered in dore' form, then it would be necessary to deliver it to the Englehard, or Johnson & Mathey Refinery on behalf of the Buyer's account - on a delivery versus payment basis, after assay, melt, and refining. For a guaranteed purchase for a year to five year duration, the Buyer would undoubtedly wish a discount of between 5% to 20% under the London Metals Exchange, second fixing on (the) day of settlement - with the discount dependent on the location, amount and length of purchase guarantee, and all parameters.


However, if the product is already refined in 12.5 kg. bars with an acceptable hallmark, and the Buyer wishes to take possession at the Seller's depository (i.e., Citi, Iron-Mountain, New York, J&M Refinery, Canada, or a bank depository in Kloten, etc.) than a purchase through the principals' banks or refinery is fine. If assay and reprocessing is not necessary, a lower discount would be acceptable (regarding gold purchase by the Buyer). Under this basis, the Buyer would require that standard international banking bullion procedures be followed, a copy of which we are enclosing for your perusal.

If you have any questions, please let me know, as we'd love to work with you further on the gold - and our best of New Year wishes.

Unquote:

It was my earlier understanding that Nancy's group was negotiating with several suppliers who could assist the miner with the required supply bonds. I will be forwarding a sample FGMP contract both to you and the Escapules, probably sometime next week. Although I know that further clarification and information is needed, I will obtain that data from Nancy at the appropriate time. Meanwhile, it would be helpful if I could review your project(s) information sometime soon.

1. ALTERNATIVE ONE:

- 1.1 Seller's bank shall confirm to Buyer that Seller has the product referred to in the transaction. In particular, it shall confirm the product's quality, quantity, location, authenticity, and deliverability free and clear of all encumbrances.
- 1.2 Upon receipt of the confirmation referred to above, Buyer shall issue its' irrevocable corporate purchase order.
- 1.3 Seller's bank shall confirm the transaction with the Buyer's bank. Buyer's bank shall confirm its acceptance of the transaction and guarantee of the payment. Seller's and Buyer's banks shall agree on the closing and lift schedules. All deliveries to be under international bullion procedures.
- 1.4 Payment to be made within forty-eight (48) hours (unless it was necessary to assay the product, then within 72 hours) after receipt of all documentation or upon delivery of the product, if possession is not taken at Seller's depository.

2. ALTERNATIVE TWO:

- 2.1 Seller will provide Buyer with a detailed offer to sell the product, which offer will contain information regarding the product's price, discount, quality, quantity, location, authenticity, and deliverability free and clear of all encumbrances.
- 2.2 Buyer will issue its corporate RWA and, where appropriate, any disbursement order/fee protection(s).
- 2.3 Seller will provide all relevant banking information, including the bank officer and telefax number, of its bank which will be providing the guarantee referred to in paragraph 1.1 above.
- 2.4 Buyer will telefax Seller's bank requesting confirmation of the availability of the product referred to in the Offer to Sell, and inform the Seller's bank that the Buyer's corporate purchase order will be forwarded upon receipt of the Seller's bank's confirmation.
- 2.5 Seller's bank will respond - confirming the product's discount, quality, quantity, location, authenticity, and deliverability, free and clear of all encumbrances.

- 2.6 Upon receipt of the Seller's bank confirmation, it shall be sent the Buyer's corporate purchase order which shall contain the following text:

- 2.7 The Seller's and Buyer's banks will agree on the transaction and the closing and lifting schedule.

3. ALTERNATIVE THREE:

- 3.1 The Principals meet at a prearranged time in Switzerland.
- 3.2 The Disbursement Agreements are executed.
- 3.3 The Seller is introduced directly to the bank where the transaction and purchase will be handled through the Swiss pool account. Seller to lodge all documents at the bank for verification.
- 3.4 The close and lifting schedule will be arranged directly between the principal banks. Payment to be made per the Disbursement Instructions on completion of each lift.

4. ALTERNATIVE FOUR:

- 4.1 Seller's bank shall confirm to Buyer or Buyer's bank that Seller has the product referred in the transaction. 5. ALTERNATIVE FIVE:

- 5.1 Seller will provide Buyer with a detailed offer to sell the product, which offer will contain information regarding the product's price, discount, quality, quantity, location, authenticity, and deliverability - free and clear of all encumbrances.
- 5.2 Buyer will issue its corporate RWA and, where appropriate, any disbursement order/fee protection(s).
- 5.3 Sellers to issue a cash performance bond (in cash, or from a bank or insurance institution acceptable to the Buyer) on behalf of the Buyer to be held in the Buyer's attorney's trust account, based on preagreed terms and conditions. Such bond to be in the amount of one percent (1%) of the first lift, (at no time less than five metric tonnes).
- 5.4 The Buyer's bank will confirm the availability of the funds for the purchase of the bullion.
- 5.5 The Seller's bank will respond with the confirmation of the product, the quality, quantity, location, authenticity, and deliverability - free and clear of all encumbrances.

6. ALTERNATIVE SIX:

Dear Lavern:

I understand that Mike Ashworth has visited with you recently about developments at the Contention Mine. I am very optimistic that a significant ore body can be delimited there, if money can be raised. Making that assumption, substantial production should be made within a year.

I am enclosing an article concerning an effort to reinstate the railroad connection to Tombstone for the tourist business. This sounds like a great idea for Tombstone, Bisbee and southeastern Arizona. However, since Tombstone Development Company controls the land surface in the area of the old railroad depot, I am sure they will need your cooperation, and I would assume have already contacted you. Because mining development would affect all the land on the south side of town, I think it is very important for such a depot not to be located in that area, but better to have it on the west side of town, where it won't interfere with future efforts to extract ore on TDC's ground. I would like to work with TDC and the train company to pick a location good for the tourist business, but also not to interfere with what I believe will be significant mining development. Should the depot be placed on the south side of town, it might seriously impede future development of the TDC mineral ground. I understand that you will be in Tucson next week, and I would be happy to discuss this with you at that time.

Please find enclosed the results you forwarded from the Homestake sampling with dylar map. I made 2 black line copies for your use.

I really think the sampling done by both Homestake and myself has shown that values in the Contention Pit are restricted to the narrow main structure and there is very little to no gold disseminated outward to give a bulk mineable deposit.

Undoubtedly there are values associated with narrow structures but this does not interest us as a target.

After visiting the property and seeing the amount of shattered, fractured, broken and oxidized rock the assay results were very disappointing, but I guess values just didn't move out in the sandstone.


I enclose the results from my sampling with locations crudely marked on an aerial photo. The only carbonate we found was calcite in samples 12, 14, 18, 21, 23 to 26 inclusive, this was primarily along fractures/joints and/or bedding. Sample 14 had a white calcite clay with trace of chrysocolla.

Possibly, the old original operators (Tombstone) did more assaying and had more smarts than we give them credit for.




Photo 5 - West wall of Contention Pit near the north end showing a sharp fold and locations of samples TC24 to TC27 inclusive.








Photo 8 - View north from waste and spent ore piles on east side of Contention Lease Showing close proximity to Tombstone.




Photo 9 - East wall of Contention Pit showing location of old drifts. Note shattered, massive oxidized appearance of the sediments.

In the box transmitted with this letter are volumes of Tombstone data organized in the same manner as copies of same in the JABA files. These data include that material which was passed on to Mike Ashworth by Lavern Baxter, the return of which he was so concerned with. Unfortunately, Mike Ashworth gave the information to us completely disorganized in cardboard boxes. It got co-mingled with data from other sources. Shortly thereafter, Cowichan stopped paying us leaving a debt of about \$30,000. We have worked, periodically as time was available, ever since getting this data together, which includes both the Data from Ashworth plus all other data we have accumulated since we last submitted a data package to TDC. I hope you find this data an important addition to your current data base. I am just very sorry that we didn't get it to you before Lavern's unexpected death.

As I believe you know, the Excellon Exploration Plan which I designed, calls for a compilation of existing data into a computer map of the district. This map is already complete with most of the data in our files. However there is other data dating from the turn of the century, up through the late 1940's or 1950's. Most of this data is in various locations that we have ferreted out. The other important data is any of the TEI records you may have in your files, including the drill hole(s) you mentioned in our telephone conversation the other day, of which I was completely unaware. The third data package is that due you from Santa Fe Minerals. This includes all the drill core and cuttings currently stored on the State of Maine Mine property. As we discussed, storage racks and shelving must be carefully constructed in an appropriate building on the TDC property, so that the drill material can be properly stored, safe from weather and rodents, in a way that researchers can access it. I understand this is the obligation of Santa Fe. I would like to help you supervise this so it is done in a proper manner. There is much technical data from the Santa Fe work that TDC should also be entitled to. This includes drill logs, geochemical studies, perhaps geophysical reports, and reports on their scientific evaluation. I hope that Santa Fe will be forthcoming with all!! of this data. Perhaps you already have this voluminous data in hand. But frequently large companies are

less than fair in their distribution of this information. I would also like to help you in the review of this data to insure that you are getting what you are entitled to. This data will insure that the Excellon Exploration Plan will proceed swiftly and not be repetitive, nor miss any clues that would lead to ore discoveries.






