Dear Mr. Holmberg:

A summary of the drilling results, and interpretation is submitted. The Thunder Mountain Project comprises part of the Patagonia Exploration program of Asarco. In addition to SWED claims, the Asarco Mining Department has claims in the district. Figure 1 locates the area in Santa Cruz County in southern Arizona.

Attachment A outlines the two major mineralization centers and the four target areas of past and present exploration interest. They are:

1. <u>Sunnyside</u> deep target lies plus 3800 feet below the surface and is part of the Thunder Mountain Project. The primary chalcopyrite mineralization of the Sunnyside target has a sparse drill intercept geologic estimated resource of 650 million tons of 0.38% copper and 0.022% moly.

Attachment A outlines several shallow chalcocite zones which are upperlevel expressions of the deep chalcopyrite mineralization. The two explored targets are, A, the Sunnyside breccia and breccia pipe, and B, the Bucket Breccia chalcocite blanket.

- A. The <u>Sunnyside breccia pipe</u> was one of the earliest Asarco exploration drill targets in the Patagonia Mountains. The breccia pipe (Table 1-A) has a 5 hole drill indicated tonnage of 3 million tons of 0.48% copper surrounded by an envelope of lesser grade which is estimated at 35 million tons of 0.37% copper.
- B. The <u>Bucket Breccia shallow</u> chalcocite blanket has been the current drilling area and ten holes have cut the zone of mineralization. Mineralization essentially begins at the surface of the canyon bottom level and extends upward and under the adjacent hillsides. A potential

- 1. In accordance with our earlier discussion, enclosed please find one copy of a proposed Fifth Amendment to Operating Agreement dated October 1, 1972 covering certain mining claims in Santa Cruz County, Arizona known as the Thunder Mountain Project. This draft closely follows previous amendments which were drafted by your legal department and extends the time of the "Initial Exploration Period" to October 1, 1990. Under this amendment, Asarco is obligated to spend \$1,000,000.00 between December 1, 1977 and October 1, 1990.

Further, as we discussed, we are aware of your interest in our land holdings in Manchester, Ocean County, New Jersey, known as the Manchester Property. In consideration of your agreement to the above mentioned Fifth Amendment, Asarco agrees that should it receive, prior to June 30, 1985, a bona fide offer for the purchase or lease of all or a portion of the Manchester Property, from a third party who is purchasing or leasing the property for the principal stated purpose of exploiting the mineral reserves therein, Asarco shall promptly give written notice to Kerr-McGee setting forth the pertinent terms and conditions of the offer. Kerr-McGee shall have a prior and preferred right of option to purchase or lease Asarco's interest in the Manchester property at the price and according to the terms and conditions specified in such third party offer for a period of 30 days following the receipt of such notice. Thereafter, if Kerr-McGee does not exercise this right within 30 days from receipt of such notice, Asarco will be free to accept such offer in accordance with its terms.

It is further understood that this right of first refusal does not apply to offers to purchase or lease by third parties who Asarco, in good faith, believes are not acquiring the property with the intention of exploiting sub-surface mineral resources.

FIFTH AMENDMENT TO OPERATING AGREEMENT DATED OCTOBER 1, 1972, BETWEEN KERR-MCGEE CORPORATION AND AMERICAN SMELTING AND REFINING COMPANY

THIS AGREEMENT entered into as of July 1, 1983, between KEER-MCGEE CORPORATION (Kerr-McGee) and ASARCO INCORPORATED, formerly American Smelting and Refining Company (ASARCO),

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the parties have heretofore entered into a written Operating Agreement as of October 1, 1972 in regard to mining claims on certain lands located in Santa Cruz County, Arizona, being more particularly described in Exhibit A to said operating agreement;


WHEREAS the parties have entered into four written amendments to said Operating Agreement, said amendments having become effective May 1, 1973 (First Amendment); December 4, 1974 (Second Amendment); December 1, 1977 (Third Amendment); September 23, 1981 (Fourth Amendment);

WHEREAS ASARCO had, as of December 1, 1977, expended \$202,827.84 on Said Lands; and

WHEREAS ASARCO has, during the period December 1, 1977 to July 1, 1983, expended a further sum of \$225,838.16 on Said Lands, including expenditure of not less than \$100,000 during the period December 1, 1977 to October 1, 1980; and

WHEREAS it is the desire of the parties to further amend said Operating Agreement in accordance with the following.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants of the parties, it is hereby agreed:



Said Operating Agreement is amended as follows:

 (a) The "Initial Exploration Period" is hereby
 modified to extend to but not beyond October 1, 1990.

(b) The minimum amount per fiscal year which must be expended by ASARCO in order to continue said Operating Agreement in effect shall be \$50,000.00 per year; provided, however, that at such time as \$1,000,000.00 has been expended by ASARCO from and after December 1, 1977 (being the effective date of the Third Amendment), no further minimum amounts will be required of ASARCO in order to continue said Operating Agreement in effect. If ASARCO has not expended \$1,000,000.00 or more between December 1, 1977 and October 1, 1990, then said Operating Agreement shall terminate on October 1, 1990 if it has not terminated before that date.

 In the case of inconsistencies between the provisions of the Operating Agreement and the provisions of this amendment, this amendment shall govern.

3. Said Operating Agreement as previously amended and as herein amended shall continue in full force and effect.



Asarco is presently in default of the joint venture option agreement with Kerr-McGee due to failure to complete the minimum work requirement due October 1985. We have several possibilites to consider:

- 1) Drop out of Thunder Mtn.
- 2) Ask Kerr-McGee to forgive our error and reinstate us in the property, or
- 3) Unitize Kerr-McGee and certain adjacent Asarco claims in a fully-vested joint venture

W. L. Kurtz and I have reviewed this subject and recommend a unitized joint venture be established as follows:

- A new project in which both Asarco and Kerr-McGee will be fully vested 50-50 partners, will be defined to include all mining claims in the Thunder Mtn., Mendoza (Humboldt), and Three R groups; Asarco will be manager,
- All existing annual work and cumulative expenditure requirements in the existing Agreement will be eliminated,
- 3) Asarco will fund 100% of assessment work costs on the unitized block of 136 claims through September 1990, and
- 4) No programs in excess of Asarco-funded assessment work will be proposed until after September 1990, when all expenditures will be shared on a 50-50 basis.

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BRUNNINTIN TEDADMIRUT

The advantage to Kerr-McGee is vesting in ground where they presently have no percentage interest. The advantage to Asarco is that a position in a high grade base-precious metal target is maintained and existing onerous annual and cumulative expenditure requirements are eliminated.

The proposal should be made to TS Ary, and although both Mr. Kurtz and I have met Mr. Ary, we believe the proposal will carry more weight if made by you or T. C. Osborne as executives of Asarco.

Flux and Ventura claim groups should be omitted from the proposed new claim block, but could be added as a bargaining chip, if required. The Trench patented group should not be included in the joint venture because of the potential value of fee land inside the National Forest if a mine were developed at Hardshell. Hardshell must also be excluded.

Kerr-McGee is aware of the deep porphry copper system we found under the Sunnyside Mine along the Three R-Thunder Mtn. claim boundary. They have been mildly interested in this zone for several years, although it has no economic value. They are not, to my knowledge, aware of the high grade Cu-Pb-Zn-Ag replacement mineralization found under the Mendoza block.

All my previous contact with Kerr-McGee was through Jim Quinlan who was recently given early retirement. I do not know to what extent Ary is familar with the area, and he may call Quinlan for details. If Ary is negative on the proposal, I suggest you mention the intersections in TCH-2 (map and assays attached for your information), which are under the Asarco-controlled Trench ground, as an inducement for him to cooperate. If he is still negative, we should consider including the 13 Flux claims and the 32 Ventura claims. Ventura contains 3.6 million tons of 0.402% MoS₂ and 0.26% Cu surrounded and underlain by an incompletely² drilled zone of 50 million tons of lower-grade material.

During our recent conversations in Oklahoma City, we discused various ways and means which would allow Asarco to stay in the Thunder Mountain Project and to keep the property together. I promised to summarize the terms of an amendment to our present Thunder Mountain joint operating agreement for your further consideration. As I understand it, you would be sympathetic to an agreement which would cover the following points:

- The inadvertent failure of Asarco to meet its full expenditure commitment during 1985 would be excused.
- 2) The present requirement for an Asarco expenditure of \$1,000,000 prior to October 1, 1990 would be waived.
- 3) Asarco would agree to perform required assessment work for each assessment year, ending in September 1991; failure to perform to result in forfeiture of property.
- 4) In October 1991 and annually thereafter, Asarco would propose a budget and program (costing, say, \$100,000 annually) until Asarco has spent \$1,000,000. Kerr-McGee would have the option of contributing to the budget or of accepting pro-rata dilution. You will recall that the operating agreement provides that a party diluted

5) The remainder of the operating agreement would remain in force.

If you think that the above conveys the sense of our conversations in Oklahoma City, I will have a draft amending agreement to the operating agreement drawn up for your further consideration.

Perhaps I should mention that we have spent \$540,000 at Thunder Mountain to date.

It was good chatting with you last week, and I hope our paths cross soon.

This will acknowledge your letter to me dated October 7, with the attached draft 8th amendment to the Thunder Mtn. Operating Agreement. We have discussed this matter on the phone. I am sorry that we have not been able to come to an agreement in this matter, and that there is still in fact disagreement between us even as to the meaning of Mr. Hill's letter to me of July 2, 1987.

Our problem with the draft amendment as it now stands is that most of the exploration interest we see in the joint venture area lies on or near the Humboldt ground, which we have offered to include in the area covered by the Joint Venture. It is unacceptable to us that expenditure incurred on those claims would not qualify as "joint venture earn in" expenditures. However, as a compromise, we would be willing to include only future expenditures on the Humboldt claims as "earn in" expenditures.

If Kerr-McGee sees merit in the above-described solution to our problem, please let me know.

EIGHTH AMENDMENT TO OPERATING AGREEMENT

THIS AMENDMENT entered into effective the 1st day of January, 1988, by and between KERR-McGEE CORPORATION, a Delaware corporation, whose address is Kerr-McGee Center, P. O. Box 25861, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73125 ("Kerr-McGee") and ASARCO INCORPORATED, formerly American Smelting and Refining Company, a New Jersey-corporation, whose address is 180 Maiden Lane, New York, New York 10038 ("ASARCO").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Kerr-McGee and ASARCO did on October 1, 1972, enter into an Operating Agreement in regard to certain mining claims located in Santa Cruz County, Arizona, being more particularly described in Exhibit A to said Operating Agreement, as subsequently amended by the parties (the "Operating Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to further amend the Operating Agreement as herein provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein provided, it is agreed as follows:

1. ASARCO's failure to meet its minimum Exploration Expenditure Commitment for the year 1985 is excused, and it is agreed that the Operating Agreement has been continued beyond such date and is currently in force and effect.

2. The Operating Agreement is amended as follows:

(a) The definition of the "Initial ExplorationPeriod" provided in said agreement to terminate onOctober 1, 1990 is hereby deleted and references in the

Operating Agreement to the "Initial Exploration Period" shall hereafter be interpreted to mean the period of time occurring from the date of the Operating Agreement until ASARCO earns a fifty percent (50%) interest in Said Lands as hereinafter provided.

In order to earn a fifty percent (50%) interest (b) in Said Lands, ASARCO shall be required to enter upon Said annually perform the minimum Lands and: (i) required assessment work for Said Lands for each assessment year through September 1, 1991, including the current year; and (ii) commencing October 1, 1991 and annually thereafter, budget and propose work programs requiring expenditures for exploration or development operations on Said Lands it as in its sole judgment in the amount of One may determine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) or more per year, subject to the requirement that sufficient work be performed to satisfy the minimum annual assessment work for each assessment year ending after September 1, 1991, until ASARCO has spent the required earn-in amount of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00).

ASARCO may terminate the Operating Agreement at (C) any time prior to earning its fifty percent (50%) interest Lands, provided that if minimum work remains in Said unperformed for the then current assessment work year, ASARCO shall notify Kerr-McGee of the termination at least ninety (90) days prior to the expiration of the then current assessment work year. After such termination, ASARCO shall not be obligated to further make any may be assumed by expenditures on Said Lands except as ASARCO pursuant to the agreement described in Paragraph 3 below.

(d) After ASARCO earns its fifty percent (50%) interest in Said Lands, as aforesaid, Kerr-McGee will have the option of contributing on a pro rata basis to the

annual work plans or accepting a pro rata dilution of its interest as provided in Section 11 of the Operating Agreement.

(e) The Said Lands described in Exhibit A to the Operating Agreement, as heretofore amended by the parties, are further amended to include the unpatented mining claims described in Schedule I attached hereto, known as the Humbolt Group, which lands and claims shall be made a part of Said Lands as if originally described in Exhibit A to the Operating Agreement, provided that costs and expenses incurred by ASARCO relative to the Humbolt Group, prior to January 1, 1988 shall not be included in the One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) required to be expended by ASARCO to earn its fifty percent (50%) interest in Said Lands.

ASARCO has heretofore submitted to Kerr-McGee (f) a summary report of all exploration operations conducted on the Said Lands to October 1, 1987. As soon as is reasonably practicable following the execution of this Amendment and on or before February 1 of each year thereafter during the term of the Operating Agreement, ASARCO agrees to submit to Kerr-McGee a summary of all activities conducted on Said Lands during the prior calendar year.

3. If ASARCO terminates the Operating Agreement prior to earning said fifty percent (50%) interest in Said Lands but after making expenditures from January 1, 1988, toward meeting its minimum Exploration Expenditure Commitment:

Within sixty (60) days following the date of such (a) termination, ASARCO and Kerr-McGee will convey to each other by separate recordable instruments, in the form attached hereto as Schedule II and made a part of this pro rata interests in the right, title and Amendment, interest owned by each party in the Said Lands and the lands described in Schedule I prior to January 1, 1988.

The pro rata interest each party will receive in (b) the interest of the other party in the Said Lands and the Schedule I lands in the event of such termination will be calculated by dividing the amount of the expenditures made by ASARCO from January 1, 1988 toward meeting its minimum Exploration Expenditure Commitment under the Operating Agreement by twice the amount of the total expenditures which remained to meet the minimum Exploration Expenditure Commitment as of January 1, 1988. For purposes of clarification, if at the time of such termination ASARCO had expended Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) toward such exploration commitment, leaving Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000) remaining to earn the said fifty percent (50%) interest, ASARCO would nevertheless be entitled to an assignment of twenty-five percent (25%) of Kerr-McGee's interest in the Said Lands as constituted immediately prior to January 1, 1988. Kerr-McGee, in turn, would be entitled to an assignment of twenty-five percent (25%) of ASARCO's interest in the lands described in Schedule I hereto.

(C) Notwithstanding the termination of the Operating Agreement, it is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that this Paragraph 3 shall not terminate with the termination of the Operating Agreement but shall continue as a covenant running with the Said Lands, including the lands described in Schedule I, and the terms of the Operating Agreement shall be reconstituted and apply to the operations thereafter conducted on the Said Lands and the lands described in Schedule I by the parties subject to the limitations provided in the assignments between the parties. The parties agree to execute such additional instruments and agreements as may be required to give effect to the intent of the parties herein expressed.

4. In the case of inconsistencies between the provisions of the Operating Agreement and the provisions of this Amendment, this Amendment shall govern.

Regarding your undated memo with attachments on this subject which describe a USFS proposal to study the environmental impact of mine waste in the Harshaw Creek area in the Patagonia Mountains, Asarco has a number of unpatented mining claims in this area. These claims are part of two projects. One is the Thunder Mountain Project which is a 50-50 joint venture with Kerr McGee. The Thunder Mountain claims cover three separate partly-drilled zones of potential interest. The first is a deep sulfide zone containing roughly 150 million tons averaging 0.6% Cu as chalcopyrite, 0.15 oz Ag, and 0.025% MoS₂ at a depth of roughly 4,000 ft. A second zone occurring virtually at the surface is presently being drilled but we estimate it contains about 40 million tons averaging 0.4% copper and 0.15 oz Ag. The copper mineralization in this shallow zone is a mixture of chalcocite and covellite. Both zones are close to the border of the study area but may be outside it. The study area limits are somewhat illogically drawn and I've known government agencies to change the outlines of areas like this in the past.

A third zone located several years ago at depths of 4,200 ft. has been insufficiently drilled to make any resource estimate. Intersections of 50-100 ft. of 15-20% combined base metals and 5-10 oz Ag have been made in carbonate rocks along with a number of 20-40 ft. intersections averaging 1.5-2.5% Cu. This zone and likely extensions of it are inside the study area. The Thunder Mountain Claim Group was reduced during the 1980's to its current size of 94 unpatented claims. We could probably drop a few more claims but substantial exploration potential remains on the ground even though the targets are very deep. Hardshell is the second project which is located in the eastern portion of the USFS study area and administered by the Mining Dept. Hardshell has a reserve of 6.9 million tons averaging about 8.5 oz Ag with an envelope of 10-20 million tons containing 1-2 oz Ag. Some of this silver reserve may extend off the patented claims and onto the unpatented claims which would be subject to the USFS study.

You are aware that the vast majority of acid mine drainage and sulfide-bearing material contributed to Harshaw Creek comes from the Trench tailings which are on patented ground and therefore excluded from the USFS study. There is also some acid mine drainage from small mines farther south along Harshaw Creek on ground not owned by Asarco. Finally there is nearly constant drainage coming from one of the Trench mine shafts which drains into Alum Gulch but this shaft is also on patented ground owned by Asarco. Major contributors to what could be perceived as a problem are the Trench tailings and one of the Trench shafts.

You mentioned that "Humboldt Creek" had been identified as a serious problem by someone. There is no Humboldt Creek, but there is a Humboldt mine in Alum Gulch where a moderate-size dump exists with minor sulfides. Sulfides have also been exposed along Alum Gulch by the natural process of erosion. You asked whether we could drop the claim which covers the Humboldt mine even though this would be a small hole in a larger claim block and we could do this. However, the Humboldt mine is part of a rather centrally located group of 7 unpatented claims we have optioned from a local resident. Our agreement with him is silent regarding whether we could drop one claim without dropping all of this group. The Humboldt group covers the carbonate-hosted mineralization which has potential for 5-40 million tons of massive base-precious mineralization which, although deep, hot and difficult to explore from the surface may be a very large resource of metal.

My own view is that although the Humboldt mine contribution to Alum Gulch may be measurable (anything is measurable) it is negligible in comparison to the Trench mine drainage and tailings. I will forward your memo to Mr. Anzalone who can respond with regard to the Hardshell project (Mr. Maley has the description of the USFS study). By copy of this letter I am asking Mr. Sell to inquire at the Coronado National Forest headquarters regarding the progress of this study. I do not know what deadlines I am working with as the USFS study you gave me has no time limits. I am not willing to simply drop the Humboldt group of 7 claims as I view the mine waste contributed to Alum Gulch from these claims as insignificant. Mr. Sell should determine what the time limits are for this study and he and Mr. Maley can monitor its progress. I will await comment from Messrs. Osborne, Brown, Sell, and Anzalone on this subject.



Dear Mr. Sell:

You may recall we discussed my 1972 mapping of the lapilli tuff in the diatreme when we were reviewing TM-14. I noted two aspects of the lapilli tuff of possible importance. distribution of sericite from outcrop The first was the and microscopic work which occurs throughout the lapilli tuff. This pattern distorts the geometry of the alteration zones by causing a substantial eastward bulge toward the Trench mine. Although the mica looks like sericite in thin section, it may be a poorly crystallized illitic clay-mica which formed by relatively cool groundwater alteration of glassy ash particles rather than as the silicate alteration component of the quartzsericite-pyrite assemblage. In other words, the bulk of the sericite in the eastern part of the diatreme may not reflect perasive hydrothermal alteration during a sulfide-mineralizing event. This conclusion receives some support by the instant cutoff of sericite (illite) at the diatreme - diabase contact just west of the Trench mine.

A second aspect of possible importance is an outcrop mapped as xenolithic quartz feldspar porphyry along the basal contact of the diatreme on the north side of the gully located 1000 ft. northwest of the Humboldt mine portal. I had a problem interpreting this outcrop and decided to lump it with part of the diatreme assemblage. Some of this uncertainty may be expressed on my field sheets and notes which you have. I did not cut any thin sections of this rock.


The problem, as I recall, related to an apparent northeastdipping foliation in the outcrop when viewed at 100-300 ft. distance which couldn't be documented at close range. I also recall the rock may have lacked xenocrysts, but probably discounted this due to variable mineralogy of the xenolithic quartz feldspar porphyry. The importance of this outcrop is that if it isn't part of the diatreme suite, it is likely part of the Hardshell volcanic suite which is otherwise terminated in outcrop southeast of the diatreme. An outcrop of Hardshell volcanics northwest of the Trench mine would mean the top of the underlying Paleozoic carbonate section could be as much as 4000 ft. nearer the surface than would be predicted from projection of dips in the Hardshell volcanics, or about 1000-1500 ft. deep.

The geometry of this speculation would be similar to that which must occur between the Hardshell silver deposit and TM-13. Based on dips in carbonate outcrops taken south of Hardshell the top of the Paleozoic section beneath the Trench mine should have been 8000-9000 ft. deep, but was in fact about 4000 ft. deep. The explanation for this is the presence of a concealed easterly-striking fault which brings the north side up. If the tuff outcrop northwest of the Humboldt mine is part of the Hardshell suite, there must be a second fault between TCH-2 and the tuff outcrop in question which again brings the north side up. Perhaps these upfaulted blocks were part of the caldera wall northwest of the moat that existed in the TM-13/TCH-2 area which now contains abundant flow-banded volcanic rocks below the Hardshell tuff.

Comments: Sericite Alteration -Distribution of Hardshell Tuff Thunder Mountain/Trench Projects Santa Cruz County, AZ

I have read F. T. Graybeal's letter to you concerning the review of TM-14 core that you both did here in late February while I was field-tripping in the Mohave. I have a number of additional comments and questions concerning his ideas. I will also briefly mention my feelings on the volcanic stratigraphy in and north of the Chief Diatreme

Dr. Graybeal suggests that the distribution of sericite in the Trench-Mendoza-Thunder Mountain area is distorted to the east by the presence of the Chief Lapilli Tuff (see Map MVK 5332). I agree that it may be difficult if not impossible to distinguish between "deuteric" groundwatervolcanic-hot spring related illitic-clay/hydromica and sericite of the quartz-sericite-pyrite assemblage. X-ray diffraction work that I did in 1981 on TCH-2 showed both illite and sericite but also local montmorillonite-group clays in the lapilli tuff and underlying Hardshell Tuff Breccia. Sericite appeared to be the more common mineral in both rock types. Because of mixtures and overprinting of original lower-rank, illitic alteration by sericite in the later-stage phyllic-advanced argillic hydrothermal process the present amounts of these minerals do not give a good indication of all previous events. I believe that the major point that Dr. Graybeal was trying to make (at least in 1972) was the continuity of volcanism-intrusion with alteration-mineralization.

Probably as important as different times-alteration events on the present alteration assemblage are the differences in host rock composition and permeability. The lapilli tuff is much more permeable and therefore more totally reactive than the "diabase"--even though the diabase contains more mafic minerals. This is because alteration fluids in the diabase were largely constricted to fracture-fault-fissure zones including the amygdaloid top of the trachyandesite flows while fluids through the poorly consolidated, bedded Chief Lapilli Tuff soaked the lapilli.

I do not believe we are looking at a distortion of "apparent-sericitic" to the east in the diatreme as Dr. Graybeal suggested in his letter because the first 600' (400-1000' depth) of Hardshell Tuff Breccia in TCH-2 <u>under</u> the Chief Tuff is <u>even more</u> sericite > clay altered than the Chief (this <u>could</u> be due to more faulting in the Hardshell though)--see Fig. 3, TCH-2 report. The texture in the Hardshell here is often totally destroyed and the core is often plastic when wet! There are also considerable amounts of montmorillonite \geq sericite > kaolinite in the TCH-1 diabase but as Dr. Graybeal point out the diabase is less altered than the Chief Tuffs. Although there is undoubtedly some "mushrooming" of alteration within the Chief Diatreme I believe the surface alteration/mineralization and that in the upper portion of the holes are an excellent indication of what to expect at depth.

As to mystery outcrop 1000 ft. NW of the Humboldt Mine adit which could be part of the Hardshell Group, Dr. Graybeal has mentioned this to me several times before--first in Nov. 1980. I remember looking through his field sheets and notes when he sent them here in Aug. 1981 and I did not find a description of the type of outcrop he mentioned. I have last week read through his notes and maps carefully again and cannot find any specific mention of such an outcrop--although plenty of ruminating about the nature of the xenolithic quartz feldspar porphyry.

I have been on the north side of the diatreme several times south of World's Fair and even spent an hour last week looking around 1000' NW of the Humboldt adit without finding the specific outcrop. He could mean sample site 236 which he has marked as xeno QFP with penciled note: "better guess is qtz latite" (this 4000' NW of the Humboldt adit). This would only be a portion of the Cretaceous quartz latite porphyry which crops out 300' NW of No. 236. Perhaps a photograph is available or I could return the two field sheets which cover the area for an "x"-marks-the-spot?

Perhaps an even better idea is that the next time Dr. Graybeal comes to town we might have a mini-field symposium on the nature of the Chief Diatreme-tuff including looking at some core skeletons. Many of the units and boundaries of various mapping units appear to me (and others) to be obscure in the field. I have discussed xenolithic quartz feldspar problems a little in the Oct. 6, 1982 TM-14 report suggesting the term crystal lithic lapilli tuff for xenolithic QFP unless quartz feldspar porphyry intrusives have engulfed xenoliths of tuff or other rocks. Of course this grades into IBX-intrusive breccia or intrusion (wall rock) breccia of which both are present (at least in the holes I have logged).

In F. T. Graybeal's Aug. 24, 1973 report it is clear that he considers the XQFP the crystal-rich basal zone of one or more pyroclastic cycles, a phenomenon which has been well documented in many pyroclastic volcanic districts. I have not gone back and re-examined TR-10 but from F. T. G's drill log it is clear that the relationship of the XQFP being QFP with tuff xenoliths engulfed into it as he describes is the same as that encountered in TM-14 (555-650'). This XQFP phenomenon is entirely different than a basal crystal lithic lapilli tuff and XQFP should not be used for the latter as it only confuses the issue. Perhaps the confusing part in the field (especially trying to see through heavy alteration/surficial weathering) is that sometimes QFP probably intrudes basal crystal lithic

lapilli tuff units so that the appearance is one of complete gradation downward from extrusive tuff to intrusive porphyry. This phenomenon may also be confusing in core because of the limited lateral extent shown.

As to the outcrop in the field being Hardshell Group Volcanics this is totally possible although a megabreccia block might be more appropriate. I do not follow Dr. Graybeal's statement that "the Hardshell volcanic suite is terminated in outcrop NW of the Trench Mine." The complete (3700') Hardshell section including the Upper Breccia Units and Lower non-breccia (ash-flow tuff) units (type section: between the Hermosa Mine and Corral Canyon north of Mowry) was encountered in TCH-2 (as well as TCH-1 and TM-13). I also do not see how he brings the Paleozoic 4000 feet closer to the surface NW of the Trench Mine. It is fairly well known that the NW January-Norton-Hogan fault zone which extends from World's Fair to the Hardshell incline has a reverse component but there is no evidence of more than a few hundred feet maximum NE side up movement. I would not pay any attention to projecting dips on American Peak to the north because a large number of E-W and N-S faults bring the section both down and up to the north and have dropped it down to the east and west of the Hardshell Manto. This synvolcanic faulting also with some rotation was previous to the diabase and Chief tuff (which is why the lower Hardshell non-breccia units do not occur over the Paleozoic at the Hardshell Manto) and should have nothing to do with the diatreme area.

As I mentioned in my review of the World's Fair Mine (March 26) I believe that the flow-banded volcanics N and NW of World's Fair are part of the greater Hardshell Group. This would include the flow-banded Cretaceous quartz latite porphyry mapped by Graybeal (1973) north of the Chief Mine (see MVK 2626 and MVK 5332). This Kql unit of Graybeal's was previously mapped by Courtright (1951) as part of the Chief Conglomerate. This package of Cretaceous Volcanics (Kv of Simons, 1974 USGS Map I-762) includes tuffs, welded tuffs, volcanic conglomerates and breccia. North of World's Fair Mine these Cretaceous volcanics contain a fairly distinctive extrusive lava dome which extends northwest from north of the Trench Mine to north of the Flux Mine. The Cretaceous volcanic package underlies the basal trachyandesite of Meadow Valley ("diatreme") but is partially thrust over the diabase along the bottom of Alum Gulch and at the main haulage adit of the World's Fair Mine (see Simons).

Jim Quinlan has correlated Kerr-McGee's felsite-latite unit under the trachyandesite unit under Red Mountain (3000-5000' deep) with the Cretaceous volcanic package. He and I had agreed after examining the Red Mountain core, traversing Lower Alum Gulch to the Exposed Reef Mine during Red Mountain joint venture discussions in 1981 and visiting Hardshell-Hermosa during preparation for the 1981 AGS field trip to Red Mountain-Hardshell that the felsite-latite, Simon's Kv-la mapping units and the Hardshell breccia-ash flow tuff (including the latite porphyry sills or flows north of Hermosa) were part of the same volcanic sequence--essentially identical in style. Of course this leaves the problems with the Flux Conglomerates of Courtright (1951) which Simon's correlated with the upper Hardshell breccias (partially based on the presence of allocthonous limestone blocks in the sequence at Flux and Hardshell) and with the Duquesne volcanics unsolved. However the Hardshell breccias, Simon's Cretaceous Kv-la units, and the felsite-latite of Kerr-McGee all dip NE at 20-50° while the Flux Conglomerates dip to the SW and according to Courtright are in angular unconformity below the Cretaceous latite porphyry-volcanics which we are now calling part of the Hardshell volcanic sequence.

If you are completely confused by the above I suggest examining the various editions of mapping in the area. I believe it is worth 2 or 3 days of our time to examine a number of critical sections, outcrops and contacts in the field. There are a number of well-altered zones in and cutting across Alum Gulch between the Trench Mine and to NW of Flux which make a very interesting day's traverse. A profitable day could also be spent around the north rim of the diatreme from the Chief-World's Fair-Humboldt Mines and <u>in</u> Upper Alum Gulch. The area north and NW of Graybeal's mapping also deserves a complete district-scale recompilation and remapping extending onto Kerr-McGee's ground to the north.

You have asked that I list the unpatented claims that should be saved from a general liquidation of our (+ JV) claim blocks in the Patagonia Mountains. I will not include any claims in the Hardshell Group as that property is now apparently the responsibility of the Mining Dept. Assessment work for some of the other Patagonia claims could be piggy-backed on Hardshell as was done, vice versa, in 1980-81 since all claims are contiguous.

The two main blocks of claims that should be preserved are the Humboldt-Mendosa Group (TCH-2 limestone replacement discovery) and surrounding 4 or 5 tiers of Thunder Mountain ("President"Group, Jesse and Orb) and east tiers of the 3-R Boot Group and those Ventura claims (W- series) over the breccia outcrop and downward projection (DDH V37-V38) to the west.

The Thunder Mountain Group of claims of the TM-Asarco Joint Venture in headwaters of Upper Alum Gulch including the Kerr-McGee DDH TM-1 - 7 area past the Thunder Mine and south, have no immediate mineral potential and could be dropped. I would hope that enough of the 3-R Boot Group could be preserved to protect the Sunnyside porphyry copper "discovery" (TR-10, 11, 14, 15) and keep up contiguity with the Flux Group which has potential for limestone replacement at depth beneath the volcanics. Those 3-R (Boot) claims north of the Ventura Group and Pierce option and southwest of Flux could probably be dropped.

In addition those Kerr-McGee Red Mountain claims northeast of the January-Norton-Trench group undoubtedly have limestone at 3000-4000 feet depth (maybe shallower if the January-Norton Shear zone has reverse movement and brings the Paleozoic up to the north) and might be considered for trades with Kerr-McGee. These Red Mountain claims and those in and north of Harshaw have Hardshell millsite potential also.

Please consult map mm 2617 dam June 73 (+ revisions) - Plate 12 1"=1000' "Claim map of the 3-R & Thunder Mtn Area" FTG-1973 Sunnyside report and Noranda Ventura claim map (5-1975) 1" = 400' No. 0820-B. The Argentor Claim Boundary Agreement (Asarco vs. World's Fair Syndicate) should also be consulted. The following claims cover or have a good chance of covering the Paleozoic and the Sunnyside Stock at depth. SAVE:

Humboldt - Mendosa Group (7 claims): Good Luck, Good Luck 2, Humboldt, South Humbolt, Monica, Indian Chief, Silver Leaf.

<u>President</u> (8 claims): Abraham Lincoln, Bryan, Calvin Coolidge, Copper Dyke, Roosevelt, Wellington, Warren Harding, Lafayette.

Orb (10): Orb 1-10.

Jesse (24): Jesse 1-24 (those nearer Trench & Mendosa have priority) (may be limestone under many of Jesse claims).

Thunder Mountain (16): TM 73-84, 92-95

OCCI Group (21): OCCI 1-18 + Big Jim, Campsite, American Annex (possible limestone at depth).

Boot (38): Boot 70-107 (priority several tiers next to Jesse & Orb).




0.0 to 0.4 miles - Numerous gullies and boulders in the wash. Should be able to fix road with aid of bulldozer, otherwise impassable by drill rig.

<u>.75 miles</u> - Two piles of dirt washed down from upper embankment causing road to slant off side of hill. Needs bulldozer work, otherwise impassable by drill rig.

1.1 miles - Intersection of drill road BB-1 with main road. Starts at a saddle in the first main ridge crossed. Road to BB-1 mostly good enough for drill rig except for the very end where it gets too skinny and slants off the side of the mountain.

Both roads are overgrown with brushy material; however, it is light brush that can be driven through without the use of chain saws.

The road to BB-1 could be fixed with a day or less work with the use of a bulldozer.

Dear Jim:

Do you have a project where immediate determination of the metal content of a rock face or sample is of importance? If you do, our service will be helpful to you. In January, JABA, Inc. became a representative for Scitec, who manufactures the MAP III Portable XRF Analyzer. This spring, we have started providing professional services using the MAP on a daily basis, for short term projects that do not justify purchase of the MAP unit.

As explained more fully in the enclosed news releases, the MAP can analyze for silver (down to about 1/4 oz.) and a variety of base metals, using either a down-the-hole probe, or the face scanner, useful in determining metal content in drill core, veins, mine faces, muck piles, metallurgical pulp streams, etc.

I think the MAP is a wonderful geologic tool because it can be used in a variety of ways. By holding the face scanner in one position, the MAP will analyze a small portion of rock about the size of a quarter to perhaps a silver dollar, giving the geologist the ability to tell what rock or vein type is actually carrying metal values. In the scanning mode, the face scanner can be moved over a rock face in order to get an average value for a large area. The MAP is also very rapid. Analyses take from between 15 seconds to 6 minutes, depending on the results desired by the geologist. For a drilling project, drill cuttings or core can be analyzed with the results available before the next interval is drilled. The MAP does not analyze for ore grade levels of gold yet, but I hope to be field testing a gold face scanner this summer that will.

Completed reports pertaining to XRD work performed on green clay mineral and whole rock analysis of altered footwall granite. The green clay mineral was determined to be nontronite, an Fe rich montmorillonite. While the whole rock data suggests an introduction of potassium and a depletion in sodium in altered granite with respect to unaltered granite.

Thunder Mountain Project, Santa Cruz County, AZ - EA-0042

Arranged for road maintenance; excavation of mud pits and drilling supplies (i.e. wood blocks, marking pens, storage trailer and core boxes). Got drillers started on hole BB-2 which is located on the same drill site as TM-8. The hole is orientated S45°W34° and has been drilled to a depth of 446 feet as of July 31. So far the rock consists of a quartz feldspar porphyry that is highly sericitized with pyrite and chalcocite. Below 352 feet there is a different unit. This unit is a xenolithic quartz feldspar porphyry that contains less sericite and is more siliceous.

Ventura Project, Santa Cruz County, AZ - EA-0165

Same as Thunder Mountain project with the exception that drillers are working on hole V-39 which is located on the same drill site as V-1, 2, 3, & 4. The hole is vertical and has been drilled to a depth of 210' as of July 28th. So far rock encountered consist of a highly oxidized altered granodiorite down to 69 feet. From 69 to 81 feet there is an oxided andesite dike which is underlain by a brecciated zone (81 to 82 feet). From 82 to 210 the rock is vuggy unoxidized and contains up to 10% pyrite.

Expenditures for both drill holes BB-2 and V-39, as of July 25, and their locations are shown on the attachments.



Mr. R.L. Brown requested an update of the past drilling activities, discoveries, and the exploration potential of the land held under exploration agreements with Noranda and Kerr-McGee.

No drilling to date has outlined an area of sufficient grade and open-pit availability to propose a rapid expenditure of funds to confirm the grade and tonnage available. Present leach tests on the high-level chalcocite in the Bucket Breccia blanket indicate moderate recoveries of values for heap leach or in situ methods of recovery of the copper values.

The Asarco agreement with Noranda (Venture Project) calls for \$40,000 per year work commitment and approximately \$200,000 remains to be spent for a 51% vested ownership.

Each year between 1986 and 1991 I have been able to secure a waiver of work requirement, year by year. Noranda is presently considering my proposal to amend the agreement to eliminate the \$40,000/year work commitment or to a buy out of their interest. I should have a response during the first quarter of 1992.

The Asarco agreement with Kerr-McGee (Thunder Mountain Project) calls for \$100,000 per year work commitment, with approximately \$375,000 yet to be expended by Asarco for a 50% vested ownership. Mr. Brown negotiated the last amendment to the Kerr-McGee Thunder Mountain agreement which calls for \$100,000 to be spent in 1992. I have no idea if Kerr-McGee might be receptive to a reduced work commitment or to a totally new operating agreement.

In excess of fifty holes have been drilled in the area shown in Attachment A. Four major mineralized centers have been outlined with seven targets identified ranging from near vertical breccia pipe mineralization, to highlevel primary chalcocite blankets, to extensive deep primary chalcopyrite mineralization, to deep carbonate-hosted skarn mineralization of massive pyrite-lead-zinc-silver values in pods, lenses and variable massive beds.

Discussion of the four major mineralization zones and the seven target areas is detailed in the attached <u>Addendum</u> - Greater Patagonia Exploration, as is the recommended work for 1992.

The present claim block boundaries (Attachment A) show that the Three R shallow chalcocite zone (TR CC shallow) is no longer within the Asarco land or any of the agreement lands.

Table 1 lists the target zones of mineralization and a common theme is the relative low-grade ( $\pm 0.40\%$  copper or less) in both the high-level chalcocite blankets, and the deeper primary chalcopyrite mineralization. Moderate to large tonnage of mineralization is available from these mineral centers. The carbonate-hosted massive sulfide deposits have excellent Pb-Zn-Ag values. The target is deep and the values variable and in scattered intercepts.

Table 1 outlines the mineral resource of the Attachment A portion of the Patagonia Mountains. The large tonnage indicated is an asset to Asarco as a mineral producer, although to date the targets are insufficiently drilled out and present parameters indicate low economics. The agreements property position is adjacent to the Asarco Mining Department holdings at the Flux, Trench, and Hardshell mineral resource areas.

I recommend further exploration to fulfill the annual work commitments on the agreement lands and to continue to outline the mineral base.

As you are aware, Mr. Kurtz has long advocated, both verbally and in writing, that both joint venture projects in the Patagonia Mountains should be terminated. He believes the low grade and attendant poor metallurgy of the near surface copper mineralization renders the indicated deposits as uneconomic for the foreseeable future. He believes the Ventura moly-copper pipe is too small to be of interest and the deeper disseminated chalcopyrite mineralization too low grade to be economic. He expresses the same reservation on the deep base metal-silver skarn mineralization, in that drilling has indicated erratic grades and a structurally complex setting for mining considerations.

Asarco in the past has maintained a longer view on mineral assets. The expenditures needed for Asarco to be vested at 50% in the two project lands will not fully test any of the present targets, but at the time of vesting will provide outside funding contributions for further evaluation.

Dear Mr. Holmberg:

The annual summary of activities for the year 1991 on the Thunder Mountain Project, Santa Cruz County, Arizona, is hereby submitted.

In the fourth quarter of 1990, six shallow holes were drilled in the chalcocite mineralization between holes TM-8 and BB-1. The zone penetrated averages 576 feet thick with an average grade of 0.28% copper. The low copper grade lead to a ferric-acid leach, bottle roll test to determine readily soluble copper value.

Final results were reported in early 1991 and of the four samples submitted, the head grade ranged from 0.25% copper to 0.37% copper, and averaged 0.34%copper. The percent copper extracted ranged from a low of 18% to a high of 42%, with an average of 27% recovered. These low values do not suggest that leaching might be a viable method for extracting copper from the zone.

A composite sample of the three holes, with an average grade of 0.33% copper, was selected to be used in an extended leach time (6 days) with an elevated ferric iron concentration. The result from this test indicated a 29% copper recovery -- still far below that which is believed to be of interest.

No further work was done in the project area for the remainder of 1991.


Preliminary thoughts have been generated for the 1992 year, but no plan has been formalized.


THUNDER MOUNTAIN PROJECT DRILLING PROGRESS MAP SANTA CRUZ CO., ARIZONA

Hydrologic Summary Thunder Mountain Project Santa Cruz County, AZ

The following is a compilation of data and inferences regarding the hydrologic environment at the Thunder Mountain Project. Depths to water encountered on angle holes were projected vertically to the land surface from the point where water was encountered (Figure 1).

#### BB-2

Artesian water flowing at a rate of 10 gals./minute was encountered 491 ft. down the hole, 430 feet below land surface.

#### BB-3

Artesian water flowing at a rate of 2 gals./minute was encountered 485 ft. down the hole, 430 feet below land surface.

#### BB-4

The water table was inferred to be encountered at approximately 600 feet due to the driller's account of excess water filling the drill hole overnight. However, when observing the drill hole after drilling was completed, the water level had risen to within 20 feet of the collar.

#### BB-5

The water table was encountered 335 feet down the hole, 225 feet below land surface.

#### BB-6

No mention of water by drillers; however, it was likely that water was encountered within 20 feet of the land surface due to the drill holes close proximity to the stream.

#### BB-7

No water encountered, probably due to location of the drill holes high on Canyon ridge. J.D. Sell

#### Other Notes

Artesian water flow is likely a result of the highly silicified breccia exposed in the cliffs upstream from drill hole BB-2, -3 and -6 forming an impermeable barrier to subsurface water. This subsequently results in a perched water table up the canyon. Therefore, when the impermeable confining formation is penetrated with a drill hole, it results in artesian water flow.

Surface water flow has persisted for approximately 80% of the time I have spent there (approximately 8 months). Furthermore, occasional "gully washers" resulting from summer down-pours have been serious enough to wash out the drill road and should be considered as a problem if this were to develop into an open pit mine. Another problem is that this creek/wash eventially drains into the Sonoita Creek Nature Conservancy Property.

On April 11 and 12, 1990 at your request, John Malusa and I checked the area covered by SWED unpatented claims for mine workings considered dangerous. The following is our observations:

#### Ventura Area

Ventura adit open (water coming out of portal - should be analyzed) and an open adit found approximately N44°E, 2000 feet from the Venture adit.

# Flux Area (SWMD responsibility)

This area contains a glory hole, several shafts, some of which were filled, but have opened up again; also, several adits and a severe subsidence area close to the public road through the claims. This area was one that was identified in a letter from the Arizona State Mine Inspector and I would concur it is the most hazardous area we checked. In fact, vandals had blasted a road block into the old workings and access is not a problem to those who want to trespass.

#### Thunder Mountain Group

Found a shaft about 2000 feet SW of Trench Mine which is filled with water within 15 feet of the collar (severe hazard). Three adits were noted, but the most obvious hazard was the open workings alongside the access road about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles in from the main road to Lochiel.

Three other places were noted as shown on the attached map. The first area was west of main road about 1500 feet and a timbered shaft 15-20 feet deep was found as well as a partially caved adit. The second area was west of the main road about 1000 feet and two (2) open adits were seen. The third and final area was the Blue Nose Mine area. Here a fenced shaft was found that had water in it. The fence is very close to the collar, so the fence should be moved back. Three (3) adits were found that should be secured.

#### Humbolt Area

Mining Dept. had been thru this area and put up signs on all the shafts and adits.

Although a careful inspection of all areas was made, the topography and vegetation probably hid some hazardous workings. A continued search for these could be made when the found hazards are being secured.



The Arizona State Mine Inspector has examined your mines located in Sections 30, 31; T22S-R16E, Santa Cruz County, Arizona and has determined a dangerous situation exists.

The Arizona Revised Statute §27-318 states:

"Abandoned and inactive mines to be secured; inspector authority; violation; classification

A. Every mine operator or former mine operator or claimant who owns a mine or mining claim under lease, contract, permit or otherwise, who knowingly permits the existence on the premises of an abandoned or inactive mining shaft, portal, pit or other excavation which is dangerous to persons legally on the premises, who fails to cover, fence, fill or otherwise secure it and post warning signs, within sixty days of notification by the inspector and who fails to keep it so protected is guilty of a class 2 misdemeanor. If it is impossible or impracticable to comply with this subsection within the required sixty days, the operator may submit a written plan of action to the inspector which specifically outlines the measures that will be taken and the number of additional days necessary to comply with this section. In no case may the time extension granted by the inspector exceed an additional one hundred eighty days.

D. A person who knowingly and without authority removes, destroys or tampers with any warning sign, covering, fencing or other protection placed on, around or over any shaft, portal, or other excavation is guilty of a class 6 felony."

Please remedy the hazard within 60 days from the date of this letter and inform this office, in writing, what materials and methods were used to eliminate this hazard.



# SUMMARY GUIDANCE



#### FOREWORD

This booklet provides industrial facilities with summary guidance on the development of storm water pollution prevention plans and identification of appropriate Best Management Practices (BMPs). It provides technical assistance and support to all facilities subject to pollution prevention requirements established under National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits for storm water point source discharges.

EPA's storm water program significantly expands the scope and application of the existing NPDES permit system for municipal and industrial process wastewater discharges. It emphasizes pollution prevention and reflects a heavy reliance on BMPs to reduce pollutant loadings and improve water quality. This booklet provides summary guidance in both of these areas.

The document summarized here was issued in support of EPA regulations and policy initiatives involving the development and implementation of a National storm water program. The document itself is Agency guidance only. It does not establish or affect legal rights or obligations. Agency decisions in any particular case will be made applying the laws and regulations on the basis of specific facts when permits are issued or regulations promulgated.

The document and this booklet will be revised and expanded periodically to reflect additional pollution prevention information and data on treatment effectiveness of BMPs. # A BRIEF GUIDE TO REQUIREMENTS FOR DEVELOPING AND IMPLEMENTING POLLUTION PREVENTION PLANS FOR INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITIES

Storm water runoff is part of the natural hydrologic cycle. However, human activities, particularly urbanization, can alter natural drainage patterns and add pollutants to the rainwater and snowmelt that run off the earth's surface and enter our Nation's rivers, lakes, streams, and coastal waters. In fact, recent studies have shown that storm water runoff is a major source of the pollutants that are damaging our sport and commercial fisheries, restricting swimming, and affecting the navigability of many of our Nation's waters.

The States and many municipalities have been taking the initiative to manage storm water discharges more effectively. Recognizing the importance of this problem, Congress also directed the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to develop a Federal program under the Clean Water Act to regulate certain high-priority storm water sources. The issuance of storm water discharge permits under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) is a major part of the Agency's efforts to restore and maintain the Nation's water quality. Discharges of storm water runoff from industrial facilities must now be covered by an NPDES permit. To deal with the thousands of industrial facilities which are now required to be covered by storm water permits, EPA strongly encourages the use of general permits. Under the NPDES program, a general permit authorizes discharges from a number of sources. To address storm water discharges from industrial facilities located in the States and territories that have not been delegated NPDES permitting authority, EPA issued *NPDES General Permits for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity* in the September 9 and September 25, 1992, <u>Federal Register</u>. (A complete list of these States and territories to which EPA's permits apply may be found on page 16 of this document.)


Under the *NPDES General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity*, EPA requires the development and implementation of a pollution prevention plan — designed to reduce pollution at the source, before it can cause environmental problems that cost the public and private sectors in terms of lost resources and expensive environmental restoration activities.

#### **OVERVIEW OF POLLUTION PREVENTION PLAN REQUIREMENTS**

This guide provides background information on pollution prevention planning requirements for permittees under the general permit. As shown on the chart on the following page, pollution prevention plan requirements provide you with a step-by-step process for ensuring that pollutants are not making their way into the storm water discharges from your site. Specifically, the pollution prevention plan requires that you select and implement Best Management Practices (BMPs). BMPs include schedules of activities, prohibitions of practices, maintenance procedures, and other management practices to prevent or reduce the pollution in runoff from your site. The five major phases of developing a pollution prevention plan are (1) planning and organization; (2) assessment; (3) BMP selection and plan design; (4) implementation; and (5) evaluation and site inspection. A set of worksheets and a model plan at the end of the document are provided to further clarify pollution prevention plan requirements. All permit holders under EPA's NPDES General Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity must meet a number of general requirements. In addition, permittees who are subject to reporting requirements under Section 313 of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), (also known as Title 3 of the Superfund Amendment and Reauthorization Act [SARA]), will have to meet special requirements under EPA's general permit. These requirements are listed in boxes throughout this guide, and then elaborated upon in the final section.

A more detailed manual on how to develop and implement a pollution prevention plan is available at a modest cost from the National Technical Information Service. The manual, titled *Storm Water Management for Industrial Activities: Developing Pollution Prevention Plans and Best Management Practices*, provides much more specific information than this brief guide. Instructions for ordering the detailed manual and a listing of other references that you may find useful can be found at the end of this guide.

# PLANNING AND ORGANIZATION PHASE

Before you start putting your Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan together, there are two steps that will facilitate the development of your plan. These steps are designed to help you organize your staff and make preliminary decisions: (A) decide who will be responsible for developing and implementing your Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan, and (B) look at other existing environmental facility plans for consistency and overlap.

## (A) Forming Your Pollution Prevention Team

As part of developing and implementing your pollution plan, you should (1) designate a specific individual or team who will develop, implement, maintain, and revise your pollution prevention plan, and (2) identify these individuals and describe each person's responsibilities at the site.

Since facilities differ in size and capacity, the number of team members will also vary. Designating one person may be appropriate as long as that individual is qualified to design and implement the plan. The plan should identify those people on site who are most familiar with the facility and its operations; these people, in turn, should provide structure and direction to the storm water management program. In all cases, someone in a senior management position must have overall responsibility for the plan.

The pollution prevention team is responsible for the following:

- Implementing all general permit and pollution prevention plan requirements
- Defining and agreeing upon an appropriate set of goals for the facility's storm water management program
- Being aware of any changes that are made in plant operations to determine whether any changes must be made to the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan
- Maintaining a clear line of communication with plant management to ensure a cooperative partnership.

**Worksheet #1** (located at the end of this guide) is an example of an appropriate form on which to list the team members. To complete this worksheet, list the pollution prevention team members by name, facility position (title), and phone number; include a brief description of each member's specific responsibilities. This list can be directly incorporated into the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan, but it should also be displayed or posted within the facility so that other plant employees are aware of who is responsible for storm water management.

#### (B) Building on Existing Environmental Management Plans

The pollution prevention team also must evaluate existing environmental management plans for consistency and determine which, if any, provisions can be incorporated into the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan.

Other related plans may include the Preparedness, Prevention and Contingency Plan (40 CFR Parts 264 and 265), the Spill Control and Countermeasures requirements (40 CFR Part 112), the National Pollutant

Discharge Elimination System Toxic Organic Management Plan (40 CFR Parts 413, 433, and 469), and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Emergency Action Plan (29 CFR Part 1910).

Although you should build on relevant portions of other environmental plans as appropriate, it is important to note that your Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan must be a comprehensive, stand-alone document.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR FACILITIES SUBJECT TO REPORTING UNDER EPCRA, SECTION 313, FOR WATER PRIORITY CHEMICALS—EPCRA contains additional reporting requirements for designated hazardous waste management facilities. EPA's Baseline General Permit contains the following specific requirements for such facilities:

• The team must designate a person who will be accountable for spill prevention at the facility and identify this person in the plan.

• The designated person is responsible for setting up necessary spill emergency procedures and reporting requirements to isolate, contain, and clean up spills and emergency releases of Section 313 water priority chemicals.

# Assessment Phase

After identifying who is responsible for developing and implementing your plan and organizing your planning process, you should proceed to this next step—a pollutant source assessment. This is where you take a look at your facility and determine what materials or practices are (or may be) a source of contaminants to the storm water running off your site. To complete this phase, you will (A) create a map of the facility site to locate pollutant sources and determine storm water management opportunities, (B) conduct a material inventory, (C) evaluate past spills and leaks, (D) identify non-storm water discharges and illicit connections, (E) collect or evaluate storm water quality data, and (F) summarize the findings of this assessment. To select the most appropriate and effective control measures, consider that potential pollutant sources include areas where materials are handled or stored, outdoor processing areas, loading and unloading areas, and onsite waste management and disposal areas.

#### (A) Developing a Site Map

A site map is a complete illustration of site features. At a minimum, the site map must include information on the following:

- Discharge points ("outfalls")
- Drainage patterns
- · Identification of the types of pollutants likely to be discharged for each drainage area
- Direction of flow
- Surface water bodies, including any proximate stream, river, lake, or other water body receiving storm water discharges from the site
- Structural control measures (physically constructed features used to control storm water flows)
- · Locations of significant materials exposed to storm water
- Locations of industrial activities (such as fueling stations, loading and unloading areas, vehicle or equipment maintenance areas, waste disposal areas, storage areas).

Worksheet #2 (located at the end of this guide) provides guidance on completing your site map.

#### (B) Materials Inventory

Each facility must inventory the types of materials that are handled, stored, or processed onsite. "Significant materials" are of particular concern and are defined as follows:

**Significant Materials:** *Raw materials; fuels; materials such as solvents, detergents, and plastic pellets; finished materials such as metallic products; raw materials used in food processing or production; hazardous substances designated under section 101(14) of CERCLA; any chemical the facility is required to report pursuant to EPCRA, Section 313; fertilizers; pesticides; and waste products such as ashes, slag, and sludge that have the potential to be released with storm water discharges [40 CFR 122.26(b)(12)].* 

To complete the materials inventory, the facility must do two specific tasks:

- List materials that have been exposed to storm water in the past 3 years (focus on areas where materials are stored, processed, transported, or transferred).
- Provide a narrative description of methods and location of storage and disposal areas, materials
  management practices, treatment practices, and any structural/nonstructural control measures.
  - Structural practices are fixed equipment such as berms, detention ponds, or grassed swales.
  - Nonstructural practices may include regularly scheduled actions such as sweeping or inspections.

Worksheet #3 (located at the end of this guide) will assist you in conducting a material inventory for your Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan. If any of the significant materials on your site have been exposed to storm water in the 3 years prior to the effective date of your permit, complete Worksheet #3A and include it in your plan.

#### (C) Identifying Past Spills and Leaks

Provide a list of significant spills and leaks of toxic or hazardous that have occurred in the past 3 years. "Significant spills" includes releases in excess of reportable quantities, defined as follows:

**Reportable Quantity (RQ) Discharge:** An RQ release occurs when a quantity of a hazardous substance or oil is spilled or released within a 24-hour period of time and exceeds the RQ level assigned to that substance under CERCLA or the Clean Water Act. These levels or quantities are defined in terms of gallons or pounds. Regulations listing these quantities are contained at 40 CFR 302.4, 40 CFR 117.21 and 40 CFR 110.10.

Permittees are encouraged to list spills and leaks of nonhazardous materials as well as spills of hazardous materials in their pollution prevention plans.

Worksheet #4 (located at the end of this guide) can help you organize this list of leaks and spills. The areas on your site where significant leaks or spills have occurred are areas on which you should focus very closely when selecting BMPs.

#### (D) Non-Storm Water Discharges

To certify that your facility has been tested or evaluated for non-storm water discharges, you must:

- Identify potential non-storm water discharges
- Describe the method used and results of any test and/or evaluation for such discharges
- Indicate the location of the onsite drainage points that were checked during the test or evaluation
- Provide the date of the test or evaluation. (If you cannot test or evaluate potential non-storm water discharges, notice must still be made by certification.)

Examples of non-storm water discharges include any water used directly in the manufacturing process (process water), air conditioner condensate, noncontact cooling water, vehicle wash water, or sanitary wastes.

To check for non-storm water discharges, you can use one of the following three common dry weather tests: visual inspection; plant schematic review; and/or dye testing.

**Worksheet #5** (located at the end of this guide) will assist you in conducting a non-storm water discharge assessment and certification for outfalls at your site. If you are unable to test and/or provide certification for the presence of non-storm water discharges, please refer to **Worksheet #6**.

#### (E) Existing Monitoring Data

Where existing storm water sampling data are available, the facility must (1) provide a summary of any existing storm water sampling data and (2) describe the sample collection procedures used.

#### (F) Site Evaluation Summary

This step is critical, as it will become the foundation for the rest of the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan. Facilities must fulfill the following requirements:

- Provide a narrative description of activities with a high potential to contaminate storm water at your site, including those associated with materials loading and unloading, outdoor storage, outdoor manufacturing or processing, onsite waste disposal, and significant dust or particulate generating activities
- Describe any pollutants of concern that may be associated with such activities.

Once you have completed the above steps in your pollutant source assessment, you should have enough information to determine which areas, activities, or materials may contribute pollutants to storm water runoff from your site. With this information, you can select the most appropriate BMPs to prevent or control pollutants from these areas.

# BMP SELECTION AND PLAN DESIGN PHASE

Once you have identified and assessed potential and existing sources of storm water contamination at your facility, the next step is to select the proper Best Management Practices (BMPs) that will address these pollutant sources. To satisfy the requirements of this phase, you must provide a narrative description of the BMPs you have selected for your site. At a minimum, your plan must incorporate the following eight "baseline" BMPs: (A) good housekeeping, (B) preventive maintenance, (C) visual inspections, (D) spill prevention and response, (E) sediment and erosion prevention, (F) traditional storm water management practices, (G) other BMPs as appropriate, (H) employee training, and (I) recordkeeping and reporting. A number of these BMPs are discussed below.

#### (A) Good Housekeeping

Good housekeeping practices are designed to maintain a clean and orderly work environment. Often the most effective first step towards preventing pollution in storm water from industrial sites involves merely using good common sense to improve the facility's basic housekeeping methods. The following are some simple procedures that a facility can consider incorporating into an effective good housekeeping program:

- Improve operation and maintenance of industrial machinery and processes.
- Implement careful material storage practices.
- Maintain up-to-date material inventory.
  - Identify all chemical substances present in the workplace.
  - Label all containers showing name and type of substance, stock number, etc.
- Schedule routine cleanup operations.
- Maintain well-organized work areas.
- Train employees about good housekeeping practices.

#### (B) Preventive Maintenance

Each permittee must develop a preventive maintenance program that involves inspections and maintenance of storm water management devices and routine inspections of facility operations to detect faulty equipment. Equipment (such as tanks, containers, and drums) should be checked regularly for signs of deterioration.

**EPCRA, SECTION 313, FACILITY PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS**—All areas of the facility must be inspected for the following at appropriate intervals as specified in the plan:

- Leaks or conditions that would lead to discharges of Section 313 water priority chemicals
- Conditions that could lead to direct contact of storm water with raw materials, intermediate materials, waste materials or products
- Piping, pumps, storage tanks and bins, pressure vessels, process and material handling equipment, and material bulk storage areas for leaks, wind blowing, corrosion, support or foundation failure, or other deterioration or noncontainment.

#### (C) Visual Inspections

Regular visual inspections are your means to ensure that all of the elements of the plan are in place and working properly to prevent pollution of storm water runoff from your facility. Consider the following when conducting visual inspections:

- Designate qualified, trained plant personnel to regularly inspect the facility's equipment and areas, track results of inspections, make necessary changes, and maintain records of all inspections
- Ensure that inspection records note when inspections were done, who conducted the inspection, what areas were inspected, what problems were found, and what steps were taken to correct any problems.

These records should be kept with the plan. EPA's general permit requires that records be kept until at least one year after coverage under the permit expires.

#### (D) Spill Prevention and Response

Areas where spills are likely to occur and their drainage points must be clearly identified in the storm water pollution prevention plan. You should ensure that employees are aware of response procedures, including material handling and storage requirements. Also ensure that there is access to appropriate spill cleanup equipment.

#### SPILL PREVENTION PLAN CONSIDERATIONS:

- Install leak detection devices.
- Adopt good housekeeping practices.
- · Perform regular visual inspections to identify areas for potential leaks or spills.
- Recycle, reduce, and reuse process materials to minimize waste onsite.

### SPILL RESPONSE PLAN CONSIDERATIONS:

- Identify a spill response team to implement the spill response plan.
- Identify safety measures.
- Include procedures for notifying appropriate authorities (police, fire, hospital, Publicly Owned Treatment Works [POTW], etc.) in the event of a spill.
- Describe spill containment, diversion, isolation, and cleanup practices.

**EPCRA, SECTION 313, FACILITY SPILL PREVENTION AND RESPONSE REQUIREMENTS**—When a leak or spill of a Section 313 water priority chemical has occurred, the contaminated soil, material, or debris must be removed promptly and disposed of in accordance with Federal, State, and local requirements and as described in the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan. These facilities are also required to designate a person responsible for spill prevention, response, and reporting procedures.

## (E) Sediment and Erosion Control

The facility's pollution prevention plan must identify activities that present a potential for significant soil erosion and measures taken to control such erosion. More information on sediment and erosion control BMPs can be found in the reference section of this guide.

## (F) Management of Runoff

Permittees must describe existing storm water controls found at the facility and any additional measures that can be implemented to improve the prevention and control of polluted storm water. Examples include: vegetative swales, reuse of collected storm water, infiltration trenches, and detention ponds.

## **IMPLEMENTATION PHASE**

At this point, you have designed your Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan and the plan has been approved by facility management. Under the implementation phase, you must (A) implement the selected storm water BMPs, and (B) train all employees to carry out the goals of the plan.

## (A) Implementing Appropriate Controls

In implementing the plan, a facility will:

- Develop a schedule for implementation. For example, your schedule might include a deadline for putting improved housekeeping measures into practice. Some controls may be immediately put into action; others will be phased in.
- Assign specific individuals with responsibility for implementing aspects of the plan and/or monitoring implementation.
- Ensure that management approves of your implementation schedule and strategy, and schedule regular times for reporting progress to management.

### (B) Employee Training

Permittees must develop an employee training program that covers such topics as spill prevention and response, good housekeeping, and material management practices.

The goals of a training program are to teach personnel, at all levels of responsibility, the components and goals of the storm water pollution prevention plan and to create overall sensitivity to storm water pollution prevention concerns. The plan must include a schedule for training programs.

**EPCRA, SECTION 313, FACILITY REQUIREMENTS**—There are additional training requirements for employees and contractor personnel who work in areas where EPCRA, Section 313, water priority chemicals are used or stored. These individuals must be trained in the following areas, at least once per year:

- Preventive measures, including spill prevention and response and preventive maintenance
- Pollution control laws and regulations
- The facility's Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan
- Features and operations of the facility that are designed to minimize discharges of Section 313
  water priority chemicals, particularly spill prevention procedures.

## **EVALUATION PHASE**

Now that your Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan has been put to action, you must keep it up-todate by regularly evaluating the information you collected in the Assessment Phase and the controls you selected in the Plan Design Phase. Specifically, you must (A) conduct site evaluations, (B) keep records of all inspections and reports, and (C) revise the plan as needed.

### (A) Annual Site Compliance Evaluation

Qualified personnel must conduct site compliance evaluations at appropriate intervals, but at least once a year (at least once in 3 years for inactive mining sites). As part of your compliance evaluations, you are required to carry out the following:

- Inspect storm water drainage areas for evidence of pollutants entering the drainage system.
- Evaluate the effectiveness of BMPs (for example, determine if your site cleaner or gauge whether employees are more familiar with good housekeeping measures and spill prevention/response practices).
- Observe structural measures, sediment controls, and other storm water BMPs to ensure proper operation.
- Revise the plan as needed within 2 weeks of inspection, and implement any necessary changes within 12 weeks of the inspection.
- Prepare a report summarizing inspection results and followup actions, identifying the date of inspection and personnel who conducted the inspection.
- Sign the report and keep it with the plan.

## (B) Recordkeeping and Internal Reporting

Your facility must record and maintain records of spills, leaks, inspections, and maintenance activities for at least one year after the permit expires. For spills and leaks, records should include information such as the date and time of the incident, weather conditions, cause, and resulting environmental problems.

#### (C) Plan Revisions

Major changes in a facility's design, construction, operation, or maintenance will necessitate changes in that facility's Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan.

# **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS**

This section provides guidance on some of the administrative requirements related to organizing and developing your Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan. The guidance covers (A) deadlines for plan development and implementation, (B) required signatures, (C) requirements for plan location and access, and (D) Director-required plan modifications.

## (A) Deadlines for Plan Development and Implementation

## (B) Required Signatures

As with the Notice of Intent (NOI), your plan must be signed by an "authorized representative," who is a person at or near the top of your facility's management chain (the president, vice president, or a production manager) who has been delegated the authority to sign and certify this type of document.

EPCRA, Section 313, Facility Plan Certification Requirements-The plan must be reviewed and certified by a Registered Professional Engineer and recertified every 3 years or after the plan is significantly changed. This certification that the plan was prepared in accordance with good engineering practices does not relieve the facility owner or operator of responsibility to prepare and implement the plan, however.

### (C) Plan Location and Public Access

Although all plans are required to be maintained onsite, some NPDES storm water permits may require that facilities submit copies of their Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plans to the Director for review. Examine your permit carefully to determine what submittal requirements apply to your facility. Plans and all required records must also be kept at least one year after the permit expires.

## (D) Director-Required Plan Modifications

Upon reviewing your plan, the permitting authority may find that it does not meet one or more of the minimum standards established by the pollution prevention plan requirements. In this case, the permitting authority will notify you of the changes that you must make to improve the plan.

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## SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the minimum "baseline" BMPs discussed in previous sections, facilities may be subject to additional "special" requirements. Not all facilities will have to include these special requirements in their Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan. Be sure to check your permit closely for these conditions. In particular, EPA's general permit includes special requirements for (A) facilities that discharge storm water through municipal separate storm sewer systems, (B) facilities subject to EPCRA, Section 313, reporting requirements, and (C) facilities with salt storage piles.

## (A) Special Requirements for Discharges Through Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems

Industrial facilities that discharge storm water through a large or medium municipal separate storm sewer system (serving a population of 100,000 or more) must comply with any applicable conditions established by the municipality's storm water management program. These facilities will be notified by the municipality. Examples of conditions could include additional monitoring requirements and/or additional source control requirements.

### (B) Special Requirements for EPCRA, Section 313, Reporting Facilities

In addition to the other special requirements identified in this guide, the following specific control requirements must be practiced in areas where Section 313 water priority chemicals are stored, handled, processed, or transferred:

- Provide containment, drainage control, and/or diversionary structures (prevent or minimize runon by installing curbing, culverting, gutters, sewers, or other controls, and/or prevent or minimize exposure by covering storage piles).
- Prevent discharges from liquid storage areas (store liquid materials in compatible storage containers and/or provide secondary containment designed to hold the volume of the largest storage tank plus precipitation).
- Prevent discharges from material storage areas (install drainage and/or other control measures).
- Prevent discharges from loading/unloading areas (use drip pans and/or implement a strong spill contingency and integrity testing plan).
- Prevent discharges from handling/processing/transferring areas (use covers, guards, overhangs, door skirts and/or conduct visual inspections or leak tests for overhead piping).
- Prevent discharges from all the above areas (use manually activated valves with drainage controls in all areas, and/or equip the plant with a drainage system to return spilled material to the facility).
- Introduce facility security programs to prevent spills (use fencing, lighting, traffic control, and/or secure equipment and buildings).

## (C) Special Requirements for Salt Storage Piles

Salt storage piles used for deicing or other commercial purposes must be enclosed or covered to prevent exposure to storm water (except when salt is being added or removed from the pile). Please note that piles do not need to be enclosed or covered where storm water is not discharged to waters of the United Sates. Compliance with this requirement must be met as expeditiously as practicable, but no later than 3 years after the NOI is submitted.

  - Vegetative swales
  - Sediment traps
- Name of receiving waters (or if through a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System)

- Locations of past spills and leaks
- Locations of high-risk, waste-generating areas and activities common on industrial sites such as:
  - Fueling stations
  - Vehicle/equipment washing and maintenance areas
  - Area for unloading/loading materials
  - Above-ground tanks for liquid storage
  - Industrial waste management areas (landfills, waste piles, treatment plants, disposal areas)
  - Outside storage areas for raw materials, by-products, and finished products
  - Outside manufacturing areas
  - Other areas of concern (specify: )





Site Assessment Inspection

February 10, 1993

#### Evaluate the site for pollutants.

There are five areas where material handling and storage activities take place.

- The storage building contains tanks of corn syrup, liquid sugar, and the granular cleansers. The tanks were examined for possible leaks. We found that the valve on the liquid sugar tank #2 was faulty and had leaked approximately 10 gallons of liquid sugar. Although this leak occurred on 1/21/92, the faulty valve was not discovered until now. All other tanks are secure. Areas around the tanks were swept clean to determine if leaks or spills were prevalent.
- The milk storage tanks were then examined for leaks or exposure. Upon closer examination, it was found that the number 1 tank was leaking a small amount of milk to the drainage system. This leak may be the reason for the high concentration of biochemical oxygen demand found in the sample taken from the storm water discharge. The tank was temporarily fixed to ensure that no further contamination would result. A replacement tank was ordered on February 6, 1993, and was expected to arrive within 5 business days. The milk storage tanks shall be examined on a daily basis to further prevent possible exposure to the storm water collection system and receiving stream.
- We inspected the fueling station to see if there were any leaks. The general area surrounding the fueling station was clean but we observed that gasoline and motor oil falls during fueling. In accordance with standard operating conditions, facility personnel hose down the area during vehicle washing and the drain is connected to the storm sewer. We detected this connection on 1/19/93 during one of the non-storm water discharge assessment visual inspections. Since this discharge is not allowed under our general permit, we are in the process of submitting a separate permit application specifically for the discharge of vehicle wash water.
- We examined the fueling station which is adjacent to the vehicle washing area. Vehicle washing cleaners are used here and any empty or open containers were removed from the area.

- We next looked at the loading and unloading docks where raw materials and various cleansers are delivered. The transfer of goods from incoming trucks to storage areas is a source of pollution. Although no problems were noticed, the pollution prevention team has developed a spill prevention and response plan to clean up spills quickly and report them if necessary.
- The last area we inspected was the runoff field below the employee parking lot. Here we noticed a significant amount of erosion resulting from recent construction to expand the parking lot.

# Describe existing management practices.

Grass was lightly planted around the parking lot after recent construction. The fuel storage tank has curbing around it in accordance with our SPCC plan. Also, the maintenance crew regularly picks up trash and empty containers from around the storage tanks, loading and unloading areas, and the vehicle washing areas. Used oils are collected in containers and taken to a recycling facility. In addition, we installed two oil/water separators at the drains into our underground storm sewer leading to the Rocky River. These separators are indicated on the site map.

# Existing Monitoring Data

Although our NPDES permit for process wastewater does not require storm water sampling, we sampled our storm water on one occasion in response to a questionnaire we received from the National Association of Ice Cream Makers. They were collecting information to submit as part of their comments on EPA's proposed general permit.

Based upon the high concentration of BOD in the storm water samples collected, pollution prevention team is considering possible potential sources of BOD. We will look at storage areas housing butter fat, milk, and whey solids tanks.

## summary of Pollutant Sources

### March 5, 1993

Based on the site assessment inspection conducted on 12/1/92, the pollution prevention team identified four potential sources of pollutants:

- Oil and grease stains on the pavement in the fueling area indicate oil and grease may be picked up by storm water draining to the storm sewer. This area drains into the storm sewer leading to the Rocky River.
  - Sediment and erosion potential in the field below the employee parking lot because of thinly planted grass.
  - Potential for spills or leaks from liquid storage tanks, including the fuel storage tank, based on a spill that occurred on 1/21/92 and the leak that was detected in the milk storage tank. These pollutants would drain into the piped outfall into the Rocky River.

• Use of a toxic cleaning agent may result in a pollution problem if handled improperly.

## Description of Storm Water Management Measures Taken Based on Site Assessment Phase

#### March 5, 1993

These measures correspond to the pollutant sources identified on the preceding page.

#### Oil and grease from fueling area.

We installed drip pads around the fuel pumps to pick up spilled gas and oil during truck refueling. These will be inspected regularly to make sure they are working well.

Sediment and erosion in the field below the employee parking lot.

We planted grass in this area to reduce potential for erosion.

#### Leaks/spills from liquid storage tanks.

We are in the process of installing curbing around the outdoor liquid storage tanks that will contain the volume of he largest tank in case a spill should occur. The spill response team has developed procedures to clean up this area should a spill occur. We are incorporating spill response procedures from our SPCC plan.

### Toxic cleaning agent.

We have discontinued the use of this agent and are replacing it with a non-toxic cleaning agent.



Dear Mr. Graybeal:

I am in receipt of a copy of your letter of May 28, 1993 addressed to Harold Holmberg, advising Kerr-McGee that ASARCO desired to terminate the Operating Agreement as amended, in its entirety.

Kerr-McGee has now received the Summary Report-Thunder Mountain Project dated 7-14-93 from James D. Sell. This report and data is being evaluated. We will advise you whether or not Kerr-McGee desires to be assigned interest in any of the Subject Land. Please advise as to completeness of all reclamation on the Subject Lands. In all probability, Kerr-McGee will not want to accept any assignments and will not want to maintain open roads and thus your activities toward reclamation could proceed to completion.

I am also in receipt of a package which arrived about June 29 from W. D. Gay, Land Engineer. The cover letter regarding <u>Stormwater Information</u> is dated June 23. The package purports to contain 5 items.

The first item is a letter dated 10-22-92 from William D. Gay to Mr. Gregory A. Knapp, Senior Environmental Scientist, in Salt Lake City. This letter transmits 11 copies of Notice of Intents for Storm Water Discharges. The facilities on which NOI's were completed are, Bunnyside, Blue Eagle, Wellington, Flux, Volcano, Chief, Blue Nose Unknown, Blue Nose, Ventura, Marstellar, and California. Also attached is a copy of the 10-1 letter from Gregory A. Knapp to Distribution List regarding <u>Notices of Intent</u> for Stormwater Discharges, and a copy of a 9-30-92 letter to Stormwater Notice of Intent, Newington, VA, from Gregory A. Knapp. This letter contains the following statement:

"Asarco is filing an NOI for the entire extent of each leased property as a protective measure, notwithstanding ASARCO'S Delief that it should not be held responsible for stormwater discharges from previous mining activity conducted by other operators at the site. Asarco is not the proper operator of abandoned mining facilities that it is not disturbing by its activities on properties that it is leasing for exploration purposes. In these situations, Asarco is less the operator of the abandoned facilities than the owner, who has permitted and continues to permit uncontrolled discharges to occur."

The second item mentioned in the 6-23 letter from Mr. Gay is eight folders which contain Stormwater Management Plans for Sunnyside Mine, Wellington Mine, Volcano Mine, Blue Nose Mine (Unknown), Blue Nose Mine, Marstellar Mine, Chief Mine, and Humbolt Mine.

The third item mentioned in the 6-23 letter is Notice of Termination by Asarco to E.P.A. Mr. Gay mentions that the eight terminations are unsigned and when he receives signed copies from New York he would send us a copy. No copies of any Notice of Termination by Asarco to E.P.A. signed or unsigned were transmitted with the other data. We cannot determine whether the Notices of Terminations apply to the eight mines as set forth above. Further, we note that the facilities listed under item 2 on which NOI's were filed and the mines listed under item 3 on which stormwater plans were submitted are not identical.

We would appreciate receiving copies of any Notices of Termination which Asarco might have filed with the E.P.A. Kerr-McGee feels that having filed Notices of Intent for Stormwater Discharges with the E.P.A., it is now Asarco's responsibility to secure Notices of It would appear that Asarco has made Termination as well. application for such terminations and we assume that it is Asarco's intention to follow through until such terminations are secured on the Subject Lands. In addition, we feel that Kerr-McGee may have been "implicated" by Mr. Knapp's broad brush statement made in his letter of 9-30-92 to Stormwater Notice of Intent. It is difficult to determine to whom the comments are meant to apply but Kerr-McGee is the owner of certain of the lands subject to the captioned agreement and on which certain NOI's were filed. We feel that further explanation is due including, if Kerr-McGee is the intended offending owner, why we were not notified of such conditions as are alleged to exist at the time they were discovered.

Your continued assistance in resolving these matters is appreciated.
