1964 Field Reconnaissance
J. R. Wojcik and N. P. Whaley

As I stated in our conversation yesterday, the 1964 field reconnaissance of the Oro Blanco (Ruby) Mining District was made under the direction of J. R. Wojcik. To my knowledge no report or memorandum describing the reconnaissance was ever prepared by him. If Roger Kirkpatrick had also been involved in the area at the time (and here my memory fails me), Joe Wojcik would most likely have made a verbal report to him.

The following notes from my journal will at least provide an itinerary of the reconnaissance and hopefully preclude references involving areas not covered by it. Except for abbreviated remarks on February 13 and February 18, the notes are limited to geographical interest.

- 7 Feb., 1964: "...Wojcik proposes recon. of Ruby rd. area..."
- 13 Feb., 1964: "Tucson - to Oro Blanco Mining Dist. w/Wojcik - Warsaw Cyn. - El Oro Mine in Holden Cyn. - Cobre Ridge (Li intrusives are dense, qtz rich felsites) - to stripping operation on the ridge N. of Bartlett Mtn. - Pena Blanca Lake - room & dinner."
- 14 Feb., 1964: "Pena Blanca Lake - Warsaw Cyn. - Warsaw Mine - California Gulch - to Casa Piedra - and out to Oro Blanco - Ruby rd. via California Gulch - through Oro Blanco - Alaska Mine - Arivaca - Arivaca Junction - Tucson w/Wojcik in Scout."
- 18 Feb., 1964: "Tucson - Oro Blanco Dist. w/Wojcik - SW from Oro Blanco - recon. hike around Black Peak - drive into area ca. 1 mi. west of Austerlitz Mine - best alteration to date, but again narrow, confined to zone along each side of siliceous vein network - down Warsaw Cyn. to cem... Looking for rd. to W - No luck. Dinner & room at Pena Blanca."

La TEKO Resources Ltd. has agreed in principle to purchase Newfields Minerals of Vancouver, B.C.'s interest in the Margarita Mine, Oro Blanco, El Gato and Iron Cap properties in Santa Cruz County, Arizona. Purchase price of 400,000 shares of La TEKO is subject to regulatory approval. The shares are to be released to Newfields on the following basis:

- 100,000 shares on receipt of regulatory approval
- 100,000 shares 6 months after regulatory approval
- 100,000 shares 9 months after regulatory approval
- 100,000 shares 12 months after regulatory approval

In addition La TEKO will pay to Newfields 10% of net profit from the operation increasing to 15% after aggregate gold production reaches 20,000 oz.


The Margarita Mine, Oro Blanco, El Gato and Iron Cap properties consist of 138 claims. Five areas on the Margarita Property have total reserves of 522,000 tons at .046 ounces of gold per ton. There are many more potential ore targets on the property. La TEKO after studying all of the information at its disposal and applying its estimate of costs expects that an excellent profit can be realized from the existing reserve. In addition La TEKO anticipates that, with additional drilling, reserves could be increased to at least 2,000,000 tons of a similar grade.

Geological analysis and production permitting will begin immediately.

La TEKO feels that acquisition of the Margarita, which can be leached the year around, will be a good balance to the companies' seasonal operation at the Ryan Lode in Alaska, and will give a base in the southwest for further acquisitions.

This Agreement is subject to formal documentation and approval of the regulatory authorities.

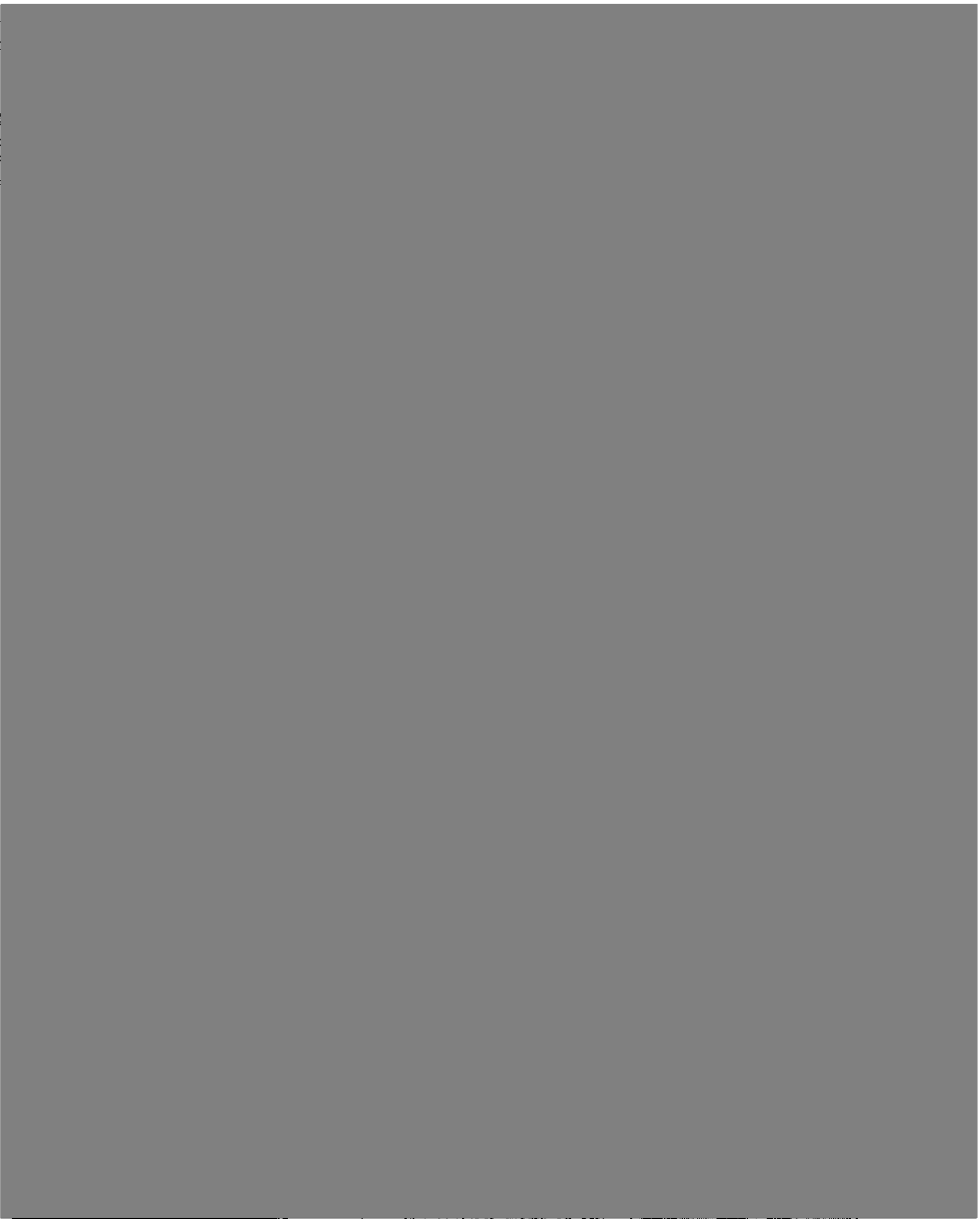

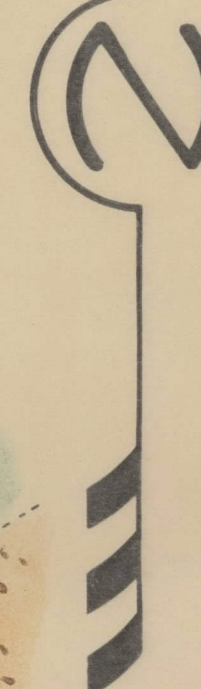
