Gentlemen:

We have received and reviewed your notice of intent to conduct drilling operations on the FB claim group, located in Township 20 North, Range 20 and 21 West, G&SRM. Your notice has been assigned file number AZA-26523. Please refer to this number when making any inquiries to this office. Your proposed activities are in conformance with Federal regulations concerning surface disturbance, 43 CFR 3809.1-3.

You are reminded that it is up to the operator to take all reasonable measures necessary to prevent undue degradation of Federal lands during operations. Access routes shall be planned to conform to existing terrain, and be planned for minimum width to minimize cut and fill, where practicable. All tailings, dumps, deleterious materials or substances, and other wastes produced by the operation shall be disposed of in accordance with applicable Federal and State laws. Sales of such materials are not allowed in conjunction with mining claims under the 1872 Mining Law. The operator shall, at the earliest feasible time, reclaim the area disturbed, except to the extent necessary to preserve evidence of mineralization, by taking reasonable measures to prevent or control onsite and offsite damage of the Federal lands. Reclamation shall include, but not be limited to:

- Saving of topsoil for final application after recontouring of the disturbed areas has been completed.
- Measures to control erosion, landslides, and water runoff.
- Measures to isolate, remove, or control toxic materials.
- 4. Reshaping of the topsoil, and revegetation of the disturbed areas.

- 5. Rehabilitation of tusheries and wildlife habitat, where applicable.
- 6. Comply with all Federal, State, and local requiation pertaining to maining activities.

Approval of this notice will not now, nor in the future, serve as a determination of the ownership or the validaty of any mining claims to which it may relate.



4. Proposed Activities:

The Reynolds Metals Exploration, Inc. (Reynolds) FB claims are part of our West Oatman project and includes most of the north 1/2 of Sec. 19, T20N, R20W and a fraction of the NE 1/4 of Sec. 24, T20N, R21W, Mohave County, Arizona. (See Figures 1 & 2). Access to the area is via the Mohave County maintained Silver Creek road, approximately 7 miles southeast of Bullhead City thence veer left, parallel to Silver Creek for 1 mile, then turn left (north) for 1 mile towards the Moss mine on a 4x4 road which continues northwest and dead-ends near the NW 1/4 of Sec. 19.

The FB claims have been explored by several shallow shafts, adits and prospect pits. Most are accessable by 4x4 roads although the

only recent activity has been by weekend off-road enthusiasts. Figure 2 shows the FB claim boundary and primary existing roads. Proposed drill site locations are shown as red dots with proposed new 4x4 roads shown in orange. Only about 1600 feet of new roads will be required to reach the three proposed drill sites. Minor repair of the existing roads will be required, especially in steep arroyo crossings to enable passage of the drill rig whether it be track-mounted or truck-mounted.

Reynolds plans to drill up to 3 reverse circulation exploration holes from 3 different sites as shown in Figure 2. The hole depth will range from 300 to 700 feet in angled holes approximately 5 1/2" in diameter. A track-mounted rig of TH-100 class or equivalent is planned.

Construction and improvement of access will not involve cuts of more than 3 feet on the inside edge and roads constructed will be 12 feet wide. All earthwork will be constructed with a bulldozer of D-7 class or equivalent. Surface disturbance at each of the drill sites may be as much as 20 feet by 40 feet. Total surface disturbance under this Notice (up to 3 drill sites and 1600 feet of new roads) will be less than 1.0 acre.

5. Start-up Date:

Reynolds desires to commence the proposed activities on or after April 22, 1992 continuing intermittently with completion of the proposed activities within approximately two months of the actual start-up date, but no later than December 31, 1992.

6. Reclamation Process:

Reclamation of all areas disturbed by Reynolds under this Notice of Intent will be completed to the standards described in 43 CFR 3809.1-3(d). To prevent unnecessary or undue degradation of federal lands during the planned operations, Reynolds will recontour, to the extent possible, all drill sites and any new access roads constructed under this NOI. Reynolds will also implement revegetation activities in areas disturbed during the proposed operations. Revegetation activities will consist of broadcasting a mixture of indigenous plant seeds, approved by the BLM authorized officer, over the areas of surface disturbance.

I will complete reclamation of all disturbed sites during my operations in accordance with 43 CFR 3809.1-3(d) and all reasonable measures will be taken to prevent unnecessary or undue degradation of the Federal lands during operations.
